# BHUBANESWAR, INDIA TO HOST ODISHA MEN'S HOCKEY WORLD LEAGUE FINAL BHUBANESWAR 2017 & ODISHA HOCKEY MEN'S WORLD CUP BHUBANESWAR 2018

The International Hockey Federation (FIH) and Government of Odisha have officially confirmed that the Men's Hockey World League Final 2017 and Hockey Men's World Cup 2018 will be held in Bhubaneswar, India.

Fans will descend upon the Kalinga Stadium to share the glory of two of hockey's biggest events, where World League and World Cup champions will be crowned.

The venue itself is already familiar to hockey fans. Not only did it successfully host the 2014 Men's Hero Hockey Champions Trophy, it is also home to the current champions of the Coal India Hockey India League – the Kalinga Lancers.

It was also confirmed that the State of Odisha will be Title Sponsor of both events. As a result, the official event titles will be the **'Odisha Men's Hockey World League Final Bhubaneswar 2017'** and the **'Odisha Hockey Men's World Cup Bhubaneswar 2018'**.

The Odisha Men's Hockey World League Final Bhubaneswar 2017 takes place between 1-10 December and will welcome eight of the world's best men's teams who, in addition to the hosts, qualify from this summer's Hockey World League Semi-Finals.

The Odisha Hockey Men's World Cup Bhubaneswar 2018 will take place from 28 November to 16 December in 2018 and will see 15 teams join hosts India at the event. They will qualify from the Hockey World League Semi Finals and Continental Championships, also taking place this year.

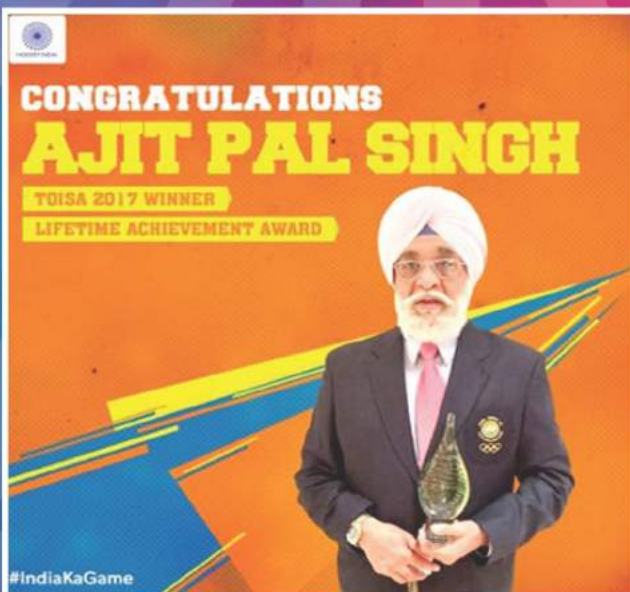
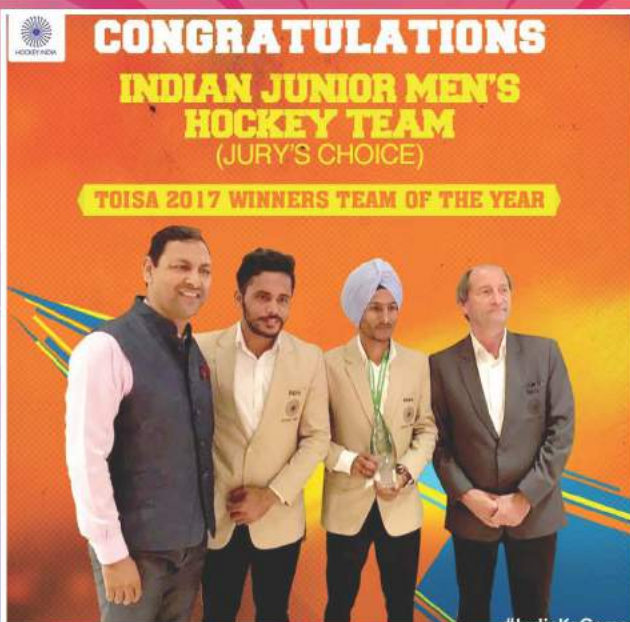

# INDIA ARE CROWNED CHAMPIONS OF HOCKEY WORLD LEAGUE ROUND 2 IN WEST VANCOUVER

India were crowned Hockey World League Round 2 Champions in West Vancouver after a thrilling final match against Chile, which was decided on shoot-out. The result means both India (World Ranking 11) and Chile (World Ranking 19) qualify for the HWL Semi-Finals in South Africa and have a chance to qualify for the 2018 World Cup in London.

Savita, who was adjudged the Goalkeeper of the Tournament, was outstanding under the bar as she denied scoring chances to Kim Jacob and Josefa Villalabeitia which gave India a head start in the shootout. Skipper Rani and Monika took India's score to 2-0 with two successive goals in shootout. Though Carolina Garcia scored in Chile's third attempt, India's Deepika converted India's third goal to win the match.

# 7<sup>TH</sup> HOCKEY INDIA JUNIOR MEN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP 2017 (A DIVISION)

Hockey Odisha emerged as Champions of the Hockey India 7th Junior Men National Hockey Championship 2017 at Aishbagh Stadium in Bhopal.

In the championship match, Amit Chirmako opened the scoring in the 12th minute. Six minutes later Suman Kujur converted a PC to double the lead for Hockey Odisha. Captain Suraj Minz was in no mood to let the momentum down and scored his side's third in the 29th. And a second from the Captain in 34th minute meant Hockey Odisha went into half time at a comfortable 4-0 lead. Steel Plant Sports Board never took off even at the start of second half. Ashwin Kujur's strike in 54th and Krishna Tirkey's last minute goal sealed the deal for Hockey Odisha as they won the title in some style.

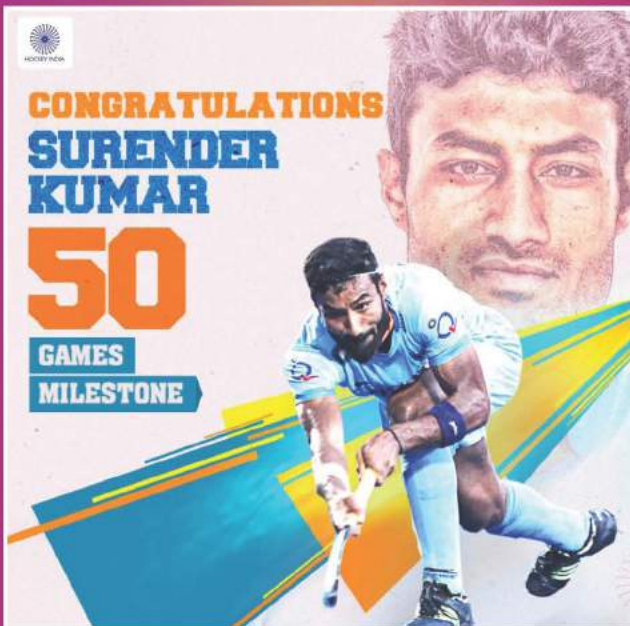
