- Empire Services Private Limited will charge a professional fee of Rs. 50,000/- p.m. plus taxes for providing book keeping and accounting services of Hockey India League. Any out of pocket travelling expenses would be payable on actual basis on the basis of bills submitted to the company. The bills for the professional services would be raised and paid on a monthly basis.

- 3. Each of the host venues to have complete in stadia branding including perimeter boards for all 6 state teams National Championships.

Hockey India to provide each host with menu guidelines for the food service for each of the 6 Hockey India State Unit National Championships, if the same is not complied then the grant to the hosts to be adjusted accordingly.

12.3 Discussion on preparations for the World Cup in Bhubaneswar and Rourkela

Secretary General informed the House that the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar – Rourkela is scheduled to be held from 13-29 January 2023 in Odisha.

This is first time ever in India that the Hockey World Cup is being hosted in two cities Bhubaneswar & Odisha.

- In all 16 teams including India are participating in the tournament.
 The following are the teams:
 - Australia, Argentina, Belgium, Chile, England, France, Germany, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Netherlands, New Zealand, South Africa, Spain, Wales and India.
- The draw of Pools was done on 08 September 2022 in Bhubaneswar and subsequently the schedule has been released 27 September 2022.
- India is placed in Pool D of the tournament by virtue of being 4th in the World Ranking along with England, Spain & Wales. India is scheduled to play their first pool match on 13 January 2023 at 1900 hrs with Spain in Rourkela.
- The Construction works of the Birsa Munda Hockey Stadium, Rourkela as well as the Accommodation facility is progress in full swing and is scheduled to be completed end of November 2022.
- The Newsletter for the World Cup has been sent and relevant information with regard to long list
 of player for obtaining mandatory permissions from Government of India has been received and the
 same has been shared with MEA.
- All the 16 teams are scheduled to arrive and depart from Bhubaneswar. The Government of Odisha has organised ATR 72 charter flights to shuttle the teams between Bhubaneswar & Rourkela.
- Government of Odisha is getting an Accommodation Facility constructed in Rourkela (2 minutes' walk from the Hockey Stadium) with all facilities at par with a Games Village. This accommodation will cater for the Participating Teams, FIH Tournament Officials, FIH & HI Staff and for delegates.
- The Construction works of the Birsa Munda Hockey Stadium, Rourkela as well as the Accommodation facility is progress in full swing and is scheduled to be completed end of November 2022.
- Fifteen Teams have booked their accommodation at Bhubaneswar and South Africa is the only team
 yet to confirm their accommodation requirement. FIH has been requested to get the relevant
 information in this regard at the earliest.
- The RFP tender has been completed in the first week of November 2022. From 14 November 2022
 the coordination will begin for the marketing activities as well as the delivery requirements will
 begin.

12.4 Incentive to Senior Men and Senior Women Teams

Hockey India will give away a cash award of Rs 50,000 for each player and Rs 25,000 for each support staff for every win the Indian Teams register.

The below is the policy for implementation of the incentive:

- 1. Applicable on the Indian Senior Men and Women Teams
- 2. Will be awarded for capped international matches against National Hockey Teams
- 3. The team will be considered as the 18 athletes including GK (even if not taken the field)
- 4. Will be paid only to the Support Staff sanctioned for these specific match
- 5. The payment will be made to each athlete and support staff annually in April each year
- 6. The incentive will not be application on any athlete and support staff that receives any doping or disciplinary sanctions during the period.
- 7. The incentive programme came into effect from 6 November 2022.

The House discussed in detail and unanimously approved and ratified the incentive to senior men and women national teams. Also, Members decided that a cash award would also be announced will in advance in case Indian team wins any of the medals in the forth coming FIH Men's World Cup 2023.
