It was yet another two months of action for hockey in India. The month of August witnessed a historic moment when the Indian Women Hockey team qualified for the RIO Olympics 2016, a feat, achieved after 36 years. The team has rightfully earned a place in the Games through a rigorous qualification process. The Indian Women Hockey team last time featured in the Moscow 1980 Olympics, where they finished at a respectable 4th position. The Indian Men team were not behind in making news as they successfully conquered

two European teams during the Europe Tour wherein they faced the challenge of France and Spain. While the team won both the matches against France, they lost one and won the remaining two matches against Spain, going on to take the Series against Spain. The same month we saw activities being initiated for the upcoming edition of the Hockey India League where all six existing franchisees retained their choice of minimum six players while releasing the rest of the squad.

This was followed by the League announcing new regulations in the month of September which became a talking point across the world. We are proud that this was initiated by Hockey India and has the approval of both the Rules and Competition Committees. Right after this announcement, Hockey India conducted a successful HIL 2015 Auction wherein all six franchises bid and picked up their team for the 4th edition of the Hockey India League. On the International front, the Junior Women National team made us proud as they grabbed the fourth position in the 7th Women's Asia Cup.

Hockey India Applauds The Indian Women Hockey Team For Sealing Their Place In The Rio 2016 Olympic Games

Hockey India applauded the historic achievement of the India Women Hockey Team for booking their berth in the upcoming 2016 Rio Olympics. The team is featuring in the all important tournament after a gap of 36 years. The team has rightfully earned the place in the Games through a rigorous qualification process. The Indian Women Hockey team last time featured in the Moscow 1980 Olympics, where they finished at a respectable 4th position.

The team posted a 5th place finish in the FINTRO Hockey World League Semi-Final 2015 in Antwerp, Belgium to ensure that they remained in contention for the Olympics. The berth was confirmed when Spain lost the semi final clash between England and Spain during the Unibet Euro Hockey Championships 2015 (Women). While the former already had a confirmed seat at Rio, a win for Spain would have meant they would have progressed through to the final and stayed in contention for qualification for the Olympic Games. Other semi-finalists of the Euro Hockey Championships (Women) — The Netherlands and Germany — had also already sealed their places during the FIH Hockey World League Semi-Final Round 2015.

Congratulating the India Women Team, an elated Dr. Narinder Dhruv Batra, President, Hockey India said, "It is a proud moment for Hockey India and the whole country. We have been waiting for this for the last 36 years and this achievement is the sweetest and the most memorable among all our previous feats in recent times. I congratulate all the players and coaching staff who made this dream real and this achievement also shows their





commitment toward their responsibilities. Hockey India thanks all the coaches who trained these players at their respective academies, parents, sponsors and the entire hockey fraternity, who continuously motivated the players and without their support, we could not have achieved this success. I am sure the girls will make us proud at the Olympics."

Hockey India Secretary General Mohd Mushtaque Ahmad added: "The Olympics qualification is indeed a great achievement for the India Women Team and the Indian hockey fraternity. The players and the Coaching Staff have done a commendable job and they are still training hard for the 2016 Olympic Games. Hockey India is doing its part and fulfilling all the requirements of the team. I congratulate the whole team and the people who have been working hard behind the scene to achieve this success. However, the job is still half done and the team now has to set a new aim of clinching the first Olympic medal."

Among the final 12 places in the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, ten teams have booked their berths till now. Korea (2014 Incheon Asian Games champion), Great Britain, China, Germany, Argentina, The Netherlands, Australia, New Zealand (top finishers of the 2015 FIH HWL Semi-Final Round which took place in Antwerp and Valencia) and United States (2015 Toronto Pan-American Games champion) and India now becoming the 10th team to qualify. The last two participating teams will be confirmed in the 2015 African Qualifying Tournament in Egypt and 2015 Oceania Cup in New Zealand.

The 2016 Summer Olympics will start with a glittering Opening Ceremony on 5th August at Maracana Stadium in Rio de Janeiro and the Women team will commence its outing from 7th August 2016.



The Indian Women Hockey Team Ecstatic On Their Qualification To RIO Olympics 2016

A very happy Captain Ritu Rani said, "It's a dream come true. I am still in the process of realizing that we have made it to the Olympics. We were aware that the outcome of the match between England and Spain will confirm our position for the Games next year and we had been waiting for the results. We were overjoyed when we came to know that we have qualified. This is a lifetime moment for each player and we will ensure that we make it more memorable by giving it a podium finish."

Overjoyed on the qualification, Rani Rampal added: "This is just so unbelievable. While we were sure of a berth but now that this has happened it is still hard to believe. We had been playing and practicing for this moment for many years now. Many in the team were aware that it would be the last opportunity to achieve our dream and play in the Olympics and this time we were adamant that we will make this happen. What adds more joy to this feat was my goal against Japan during the FINTRO FIH Hockey World League Semi-Final at Antwerp which helped us put the pressure on them and finally nailing the game in our favor."

Speaking on the qualification, Goalkeeper Savita said "I still remember the game against Japan during the FINTRO FIH Hockey World League at Antwerp. We knew a win would keep us in contention and so in a way I had to ensure that Japan did not find the nets. While we had scored early, the job from there was to defend that one goal. Each one of us took it on oneself that we will defend it and not allow them to score. I think it was everyone's effort that day which has allowed us to see this beautiful day today. From here there is no looking back. We will make this qualification count and will make the country proud".

Vice Captain Deepika said "This year we had taken it on ourselves that we will not let this opportunity go and when we were playing the 5th 6th position of the FINTRO FIH Hockey World League we knew that it is a 'do or die' situation for us and a win would keep us in contention. Before the match each one of us were aware that we have to stand up tall today and not allow the pressure to take over us. The first aim was to score the initial goal and which thanks to Rani we did it and the second aim was to defend that goal without losing focus. It was not an easy game as Japan was also playing with the same goal but it was possible because we stood up as a unit. Next year we will ensure that we add another feather by aiming for a podium finish".

Speaking on the qualification, Chief Coach Mathias Ahrens said "When I came on board my immediate focus was to see that the team qualifies for the Games next year. During every game at Antwerp I reminded the players that this is their chance to RIO. They have to deliver to see their dreams come true. I am happy that I was able to motivate and guide them, which has ensured us this spot in the RIO Olympics 2016. From here now my job will be to see that they make the country proud through their performance".













Raipur, India Confirmed As The Host Of The 2015 Men's Hero Hockey World League Final

- Raipur International Hockey Stadium will host the 2015 Men's Hero Hockey World League Final
- First international hockey event to be held in city of Raipur
- Recently completed stadium to host eight team competition

The International Hockey Federation (FIH) has announced that the 2015 men's Hero Hockey World League Final will be hosted by the Indian city of Raipur, Chhattisgarh between 27 November and 6 December 2015. The event will be held in the 3,000 capacity Raipur International Hockey Stadium which was opened as a dedicated hockey facility in August 2014.

The event will feature eight national hockey teams who qualified through the Hockey World League Semi-Finals in Buenos Aires and Antwerp. They include Australia, ranked number one in the FIH World Rankings, Netherlands (2), Germany (3), Belgium (4), Great Britain (5), Argentina (6), hosts India (8) and Canada (13). This will be the first international hockey event to be staged not only in the newly built Raipur International Hockey Stadium, but also in the city of Raipur, the capital of India's Chhattisgarh state.

"The Hero Hockey World League Final is going to be an extremely exciting event, with all eight teams having qualified for the 2016 Olympics. This will be one of the last opportunities to test themselves against one another in international competition before they head out to Rio for the Games later next year," said Leandro Negre, FIH President.

He continued: "India has a strong connection with the sport of hockey and we are delighted to be taking this showcase competition to a city that has shown a great desire to host international hockey tournaments. We have no doubt that the local organisers and the people of Raipur will put on a fantastic event for athletes, spectators and TV viewers around the world."

Speaking about this announcement, Dr. Raman Singh, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Chhattisgarh, said: "It is a proud moment for the State of Chhattisgarh. When we started work on the stadium the aim was to make a world class stadium which meets international standards and I'm happy that we have successfully achieved that. Chhattisgarh is known for its love for hockey and this stadium is a step towards giving those requisite facilities to the aspiring players who want to make their mark on the international platform. I welcome hockey fans from across the world and invite them to come and experience the exhilarating hockey set to be witnessed here in November and December."

Dr Narinder Dhruv Batra, President of Hockey India, added further support to the host confirmation. He said:
"It's great news for the Indian hockey fraternity as Raipur will host an international level tournament for the first time. This will be a huge motivation not only for Hockey India but also for the officials at the Raipur stadium. Yet again this proves our capabilities to host tournaments of this stature, effortlessly and perfectly. This will provide a huge opportunity for the people of Chhattisgarh to watch incredible hockey skills as teams compete to grab the tournament title. Tournaments like these will inspire the young generation to take up hockey as a career, which we hope will enhance our talent pool in the future."

This is the second edition of the Hockey World League. The inaugural Hockey World League men's Final was held in New Delhi, India and was won by the Netherlands.

The team enjoyed an impressive winning campaign as they stepped up defensively on the field and took good control of the game in every match that they played against France and Spain.

Speaking from the IGI Airport, Roelant Oltmans, Director, High Performance and Indian Men Team Chief Coach stated, "The team performed exceptionally well in the European Tour which proves that our players are ready to take on greater challenges. The highlight was that we did not give away the ball possession easily to the opponents and with the FIH Hockey World League Final scheduled to take place towards the end of this year, I hope the team do its best and display high-level performances."

Hockey India League Announces New Rules & Regulations For The Upcoming HIL 2016

After three highly competitive seasons of the Hockey India League (HIL), the Governing Committee will now bring new rules and regulations to make the world's best league more competitive and intense. The announcement of the new rules was made at a press conference addressed by Dr Narinder Dhruv Batra, Chairman, Hockey India League.

From the 2016 season of Hockey India League, franchisees can have a squad of 20 players with a composition of 12 Indian players and eight foreign players. The squad must have minimum two goalkeepers sitting on the bench and all the players of 20-member squad will be mentioned in the Match Sheet and must be present at their respective team's dug-out during the HIL matches.

As per the new goal-scoring points system, the HIL 2016 will be known as the most competitive and first of its kind in any hockey competition where field goals will be given more priority than penalty corners. In the HIL 2016 matches, 2 goal points will be awarded for every Field Goal to encourage more skilful and tactical hockey. To curb rough tackles and maintain discipline among players, 2 goal points will awarded to every Penalty-Stroke Goal scored other than resulting from penalty corner.

Two goals will also be awarded for every goal scored from a Penalty-Stroke resulting from a Penalty Corner where a goal being scored is prevented by a deliberate foul. The new goal-scoring system is approved by the FIH Competitions Committee and Rules Committee, which will promote spirited hockey and fair play among all players.

The rest of the Goal-Scoring point system remains the same where Penalty Corner goals, goal scored from a Penalty Stroke resulting from a Penalty Corner (where a goal being scored is prevented as a results of the ball hitting a foot or body) as well as a goal from a direct shoot-out and Penalty Stroke goals in a shoot-out competition will be considered as 1 goal point.

With the new rules and regulations, the Hockey India League will see the worlds best players showcase their hockey skills to score more goals through field goals. The new regulations will also reduce the aggressive moves and maintain discipline among players.

Speaking on the announcement Hockey India President and Hockey India League Chairman Dr. Narinder Dhruv Batra said, "Penalty Corners give undue advantage to those teams which have penalty corner specialists. The teams also fight to earn penalty corners rather than scoring goals through field penetration. The new system will encourage teams and players to play to score goals instead of looking for penalties. The system will surely enhance players' skills and mentality of playing good hockey. HIL is committed to promoting the worlds best hockey and with this new rules, players will improve themselves in a competitive environment. We expect Hockey India League to continue its legacy of high-class hockey and take the sport to a new level."

Hockey India League 2015 auction is all slated for 17th September wherein 135 Indian and 136 Foreign Players will go under the hammer. Earlier in August 2015, Hockey India League had provided all the franchisees the option to retain upto 3 Indian and 3 Foreign players, while releasing the rest of the squad. With 271 players to get auctioned, each franchisee will be looking at a strong team with the hope of having the required edge over others.

The 2015 auction of Hockey India League witnessed an intense and nail biting day as the six franchisees picked their team from the 271 players which went under the hammer at Hotel Lalit, New Delhi. With 135 Indian and 136 foreign players, the day started with Kieran Govers who was bought by Dabang Mumbai at USD 36000 post an intense round of bidding. This set the tone for the auction and there was no looking back for each franchisee as each one got into business to strategically bid and build the right mix of player combination for their teams.

Kelly Fairweather, CEO, FIH who was present for the auctions said "The League has attained a unique position in the world of hockey. There is considerable excitement in the fraternity for the event which is growing in stature year after year. The auctions are being held in the most professional manner and are throwing many surprises in terms of bidding and choice of players. The increasing choice of opting for younger player is an indication that the teams are keen to experiment with fresh talent."

Talking on the League and the Auction Dr Narinder Dhruv Batra, Chairman Hockey India League and President Hockey India said "There was no predefined criteria for the selection of players, so there was no restriction on the base price of the players and this decision was left with the players. The auctions have concluded successfully and I am happy to see the excitement amongst franchisee to build fresh teams."

Commenting on the League, Cam Vale, CEO Hockey Australia said "HIL is a very important League across the world. Hockey Australia did not give it a second thought to sign a MOU with Hockey India for the test series and releasing its players for HIL. We are committed to provide our players for the League as this also gives them a wonderful platform to play and learn from other players from across the world."



Hockey India League 2016 will have its inaugural match in Bhubaneswar and the Finale will be played in Ranchi.


































































7th Women's Junior Asia Cup 2015

Hockey India and Hockey New Zealand Announces Six-Match Test Series

Hockey India and Hockey New Zealand announced a six match series between India and New Zealand scheduled to take place from 2nd to 11th October 2015. The matches will be played in Auckland, Nelson and Christchurch. While India will play the first two matches against the New Zealand A team the last four matches will be played against the New Zealand senior men team. For India the Tour will be in preparation for the all important FIH Hockey World League Final 2015 to be held in Raipur in December, followed by the Rio Olympics slated in 2016 while for New Zealand they will prepare for the upcoming 2015 Oceania Cup wherein a win there would confirm a berth for them in the RIO Olympics 2016.

After a successful Europe Tour in August, where India defeated France and Spain, India Men Team is upbeat to continue their good form and expect positive results from the New Zealand Tour. Indian players are going through an intense training session in New Delhi and getting ready for the series. India would look at using the experience to prepare for the forthcoming tournaments in the next one year.

In June 2015, New Zealand playing in the FIH Hockey World League Semi-Final 2015 in Buenos Aires, Argentina finished at 6th position after an unfortunate loss against Canada in the quarter-final match. With this set-back and another defeat against Spain in 5th-6th Classification Match, they missed the opportunity to qualify for the Rio 2016 Olympics. However, New Zealand still has a chance to qualify for the Olympics if they win the 2015 Oceania Cup, which will be held at their home-turf coming October and hence their clash against India will be an important ground to gear up for the upcoming challenge.

India and New Zealand A will be playing their first match on 2rd October 2015 and which will be played in Auckland.





India Men Hockey Team Departs For New Zealand

The India Men Hockey Team departed in the early hours of 28th September 2015 for the upcoming New Zealand Tour where they are scheduled to play four matches against New Zealand National Team and two matches against New Zealand A Team. The series is in preparation for the upcoming FIH Hockey World League Final, to be held in Raipur later this year where India will be seen clashing against top hockey teams of the world.

Speaking during the departure, Roelant Oltmans, Director, High Performance & India Men Chief Coach stated, "The New Zealand tour is important for us as we will get a good opportunity to play against a top-rated team and which helps us to prepare for the upcoming tournaments in the next one year before going into Rio 2016 Olympics. The team has worked on all areas, which even included team combination and keeping the defence structure strong. In the present day hockey, conceding less number of goals is a positive factor and we aim to do this from here on".

Speaking at the IGI Airport, Captain Sardar Singh added "Playing against New Zealand will be a good experience

for our players and the Series will help us to rectify our loopholes. The Black Sticks are known for speed and quick passes. They have good players and some of them we have played with during the Hockey India League. We know their playing style and have prepared ourselves according to conditions there. The Preparatory Camp was productive for us and we have improved ourselves in various areas. We want to implement our learning and expect positive results."

India will be playing their first match on 2[™] October 2015 against New Zealand A at 06.30 IST at Auckland.

Romeo James Conferred With Prestigious Dhyan Chand Award

Hockey India congratulated Romeo James former Goalkeeper & Head Coach of the Indian Men Hockey Team for being nominated to receive the prestigious Dhyan Chand Award this year for outstanding contribution to the Indian Hockey.

The endowed goalkeeper had a great career both as a player and later as a coach. He was part of Indian hockey team who won the silver medal at the 1982 Asian Games held at Delhi. He was the lead goalkeeper for India at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics where India



finished fifth. At the National front, he was the Captain of the Services Team which lifted the National Hockey Championship in 1982 & 1985.

Romeo James also has an outstanding coaching career to his credit and passed on his knowledge and experience to the teams from National to International levels. He coached the Indian Hockey team at 2010 FIH Hockey World Cup. Under his guidance, Indian Hockey team won silver medal at the 1994 Asian Games held at Hiroshima. He was even instrumental in shaping-up the Indian Hockey Team where they won Indira Gandhi International Gold Cup at Lucknow in 1994. At the National level he guided Bharat Petroleum Team from 1994 to 2008 in which they won the Major Tournaments such as Nehru Gold Cup, MCC Murugappa Chennai, Surjit Singh Jalandhar, Gurmit Chandigarh, Lal Bhadur Shastri, New Delhi, Bombay Gold Cup, Ranjit Singh Delhi & Petroleum Sports Promotion Board.

Congratulating Romeo James on the momentous occasion, Mohd Mushtaque Ahmad, Secretary General, Hockey India said "It has been a great journey working with Romeo James. He has tremendously contributed to Indian Hockey and has been exceptional on the field both as a player as well as a coach. He has successfully served Indian Hockey for more than four decades and has helped groom many star goalkeepers like Bharat Chetri and Adrian D'Souza during his tenure.
