OCKEY INDIA (HI) is the governing body to direct and conduct all activities for both men's and women's hockey in India. It is recognized by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India as the sole body responsible for promoting Hockey in India.

Headquartered in New Delhi, Hockey India was established on 20th May, 2009 and is affiliated to the International Hockey Federation (FIH), the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and the Asian Hockey Federation (AHF).

Committed to the development of Hockey in the country, Hockey India with the assistance of Sports Authority of India and Department of Sports, Government of India, trains players at sub-junior, junior and senior levels. The governing body engages in coaching the coaches with International standard certification programs, educates and equips technical officials and umpires to find a foothold in the international arena, provides world-class infrastructure and international exposure for the players besides the regular international competition.

Hockey India has also pioneered in bringing top International hockey events to India such as the FIH Men's World Cup in 2010 and 2018, FIH Champions Trophy in 2014, FIH Junior Men's World Cup in 2016, FIH Hockey World League Final in 2017 as well as the FIH Olympic Qualifiers in 2019. With its vision to popularize the game and constantly promote it, Hockey India is dedicated to getting our national teams (both men and women) into the top three in the world.

It was absolutely fantastic to see both the teams win their respective FIH Series Finals in June 2019 and then qualifying for the Tokyo Olympics in front of the home crowd later in the year.

It's unfortunate that the Tokyo Olympics has been postponed to 2021 due to the COVID-19 crisis, however, the Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Teams will continue to be motivated and put up an excellent performance next year.

The Indian Men's Hockey team has produced fantastic results in the FIH Hockey Pro League this year. We hope that the COVID-19 crisis is resolved soon and our teams can get back on the field as soon as possible.

Apart from terrific results on the field, India won the bid to host the 2023 Men's Hockey World Cup in November 2019. It will be a record fourth time that the hockey-loving nation will be hosting the competition since its inception in 1971. It will be an honour for us to host the Men's Hockey World Cup in Bhubaneswar and Rourkela in 2023. The Indian Junior Men's and Women's Teams improved their games through various national coaching camps, which were set up by Hockey India during the course of the year. The next generation of players honed their skills and learned new techniques to evolve into better players. The results were there to be seen when the Indian Junior Women's Team won the 3-Nations Tournament in Australia. Everyone at Hockey India was ecstatic to see the way our team fought toe-to-toe with Australia and New Zealand in the competition in December.

The Indian Junior Men's Hockey Team showed their class as well by clinching the silver medal at the 9th Sultan of Johor Cup in October. The experience of the tournament will certainly help the players take their game to the next level in the upcoming years.

Overall, it has been a fantastic and energetic year for all of us here at Hockey India. We will keep working towards our goal of revolutionizing hockey in the future.

OVERVIEW

The year 2019 was memorable for both the Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Teams who secured a berth for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics Games after winning their respective matches in front of the home crowd in Bhubaneswar, Odisha.

Playing in front of a boisterous home crowd at the spectacular Kalinga Hockey Stadium, Indian Men's Hockey Team led by Manpreet Singh qualified for the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games by winning both their matches with a



spirited performance. They beat Russia 4-2 in the first match and 7-1 in the second match.

Earlier in 2019, a sensational outing in Bhubaneswar at the FIH Series Finals saw the team leave no stone unturned in their performance as they emerged victorious by beating South Africa (5-1) in the Final while they got the better of Japan (7-2) in the Semi-Final and had outclassed Russia (10-0), Poland (3-1) and Uzbekistan (10-0) in the round robin stage to make the cut for the FIH Olympic Qualifiers.

In the lead up to the FIH Olympic Qualifiers, India played the Ready Steady Tokyo Test Event in August where the team won the league matches against Malaysia (6-0) and hosts Japan (6-3), lost a match to New Zealand (1-2) but eventually won the final with a brilliant 5-0 margin against New Zealand.

The Indian Women's Team too had a dream run in 2019. The tours to Malaysia and Korea earlier in the year had put the Indian team in good stead as they arrived in Hiroshima for the FIH Women's Series Finals with a sole intention of sealing their berth to take part in the FIH Olympic Qualifiers.

The challenging event brought the best out of the Indian team as they began their campaign with a strong 4-1 win against Uruguay. They further improvised this performance with a 5-0 win against Poland and 11-0 win against Fiji. In the Semi-Final, India beat a tough opponent Chile 4-2 and in the Final the team led by Rani beat Japan 3-1.

Riding on the confidence gained during the FIH Series Finals, the Indian Women's Team set out on a winning performance at the Ready Steady Tokyo Test Event in August where the team emerged victorious against Japan (2-1) and drew league matches against Australia (2-2) and China (0-0). Playing the Final, the team beat Japan (2-1). The team led by Rani beat USA in the FIH Olympic Qualifier to win their Olympic berth, making it the first time in the history where the team will be playing at consecutive Olympic Games.

The Indian Junior Men's and Women's Teams too kept up their performance. Though the

OVERVIEW



India Colts finished 6th in the 8-Nations Tournament in Spain, in June 2019, the team bounced back at the 9th Sultan of Johor Cup 2019 in October 2019 where they finished with the Silver Medal after losing out to Great Britain in the Final match for the second year in a row. The tour saw India defeat the likes of hosts Malaysia, New Zealand and Australia, which saw the Indian team progress to the Final match of the competition through impressive performances.

The Indian Junior Women's Team registered an epic victory in their 3-Nations Tournament against Australia and New Zealand in November-December 2019 in Canberra. The team had started the tour with a 2-0 win against New Zealand, before drawing their next match against the hosts 1-1, and then beating New Zealand again by a margin of 4-1, but losing the last round-robin match to Australia 1-2. India's dominance across their four matches saw them being awarded with the winners' trophy by Hockey Australia. Earlier in May-June 2019, the Indian team took part in matches against Ireland, Canada and Belarus, along with winning the 4 Nations Invitational Tournament in Dublin, by defeating the hosts 1-0 in the Final match.

Hockey India, on the other hand, launched the ambitious and meticulously-designed coaching programme known as the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway in March 2019, which aimed to provide a simplified education structure to help in developing coaches from the grassroots level into world-class coaches of the high performance /international level. In its initial year, the initiative from Hockey India attracted an overwhelming response from across the country, with over 300 candidates applying for each of the two phases of the Pathway, which were held in March and August 2019.

The federation also very successfully hosted the FIH Men's Series Final in Bhubaneswar as well as the FIH Olympic Qualifier which was a mega success. The domestic circuit was also conducted with much vigour. Another highlight of the year was India winning the bid to host the 2023 Men's Hockey World Cup.

To help the victims of the devastating bushfire in Australia, Hockey Indiajoined their counterparts in raising funds as they contributed USD 25,000 to the Red Cross Bushfire Appeal. Hockey India also donated signed national team jerseys to be put for auction and the proceeds to be used through Red Cross to help those affected by the wildfires.

INTERNATIONAL EVENTS - MEN'S (2019-20)







The Indian Senior Men's Hockey Team have been on a roll ever since the start of 2019. In their tour of Australia, India won two of their five matches, one against Australia 'A' and WA Thundersticks beating them 3-0 and 2-0 respectively. In the same tour they lost two against the host nation's national side and drew against Australia 'A' once.

In the FIH Series Final held in Bhubaneswar, India won the tournament beating South Africa 5-1 in the final and also qualified for the Olympics in doing the same. They also emerged winners in the Ready Steady Tokyo 2019, test event for the Olympics. In their tour to Belgium, India won all their five matches against the host nation and Spain.

In the FIH Hockey Pro League which began in January at Bhubaneswar in Odisha, the men's team won four of their first six matches. They beat Netherlands twice, one of which was a convincing 5-2 win. They registered victories against Belgium and Australia as well.





AUSTRALIA TOUR (08 - 17 MAY 2019)



Indian Men's Hockey team ended their Australian Tour 2019 with a 2-5 loss to World No. 2 Australia in their fifth and final match held at the Perth Hockey Stadium.



FIH MEN'S SERIES FINALS BHUBANESWAR ODISHA 2019 (06-15 JUNE 2019)

The Indian team won the FIH Men's Series Finals in Bhubaneswar after beating South Africa in the final. The tournament was played from June 6 to June 15. India started their campaign with a 10-0 victory over Russia. In their next match, the Indian team took down Poland 3-1. India continued their brilliant run when they faced Uzbekistan, beating them 10-0. India defeated Japan 7-2 in the semi-final and then beat South Africa 5-1 in the final. The Indian team conceded only four goals in the entire tournament. Manpreet Singh was named the best player of the tournament.















TOKYO 2020 OLYMPIC TEST EVENT FOR HOCKEY (17-21 AUGUST 2019)

The Indian Men's Hockey team avenged their round robin league-stage loss by defeating New Zealand 5-0 to win the Olympic Test Event held at the Oi Hockey Stadium. India had a great start to the Olympic Test Event as they registered a 6-0 win against Malaysia in their opening match before losing to New Zealand 1-2 in their second match, and then coming back strongly in their last round-robin match to defeat hosts Japan 6-3 and secure a place in the Final. Mandeep Singh emerged as the top-scorer of the tournament with 6 goals.



BELGIUM TOUR (26 SEP - 03 OCT 2019)



Indian Men's Hockey Team an attacking masterclass to defeat reigning World and European Champions Belgium 5-1 in the fifth and last match to maintain their 100% record in their Tour of Belgium. The Indian team won all five matches during the Tour, beating

Belgium 2-0 in the opening match, and registering 6-1 and 5-1 wins over Spain in the next two games, before finishing off their Tour with two wins against Belgium (2-1 and 5-1).

FIH HOCKEY OLYMPIC QUALIFIERS ODISHA (01-02 NOVEMBER 2019)

India's men's team secured qualification for the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 on busy days of action in the FIH Hockey Olympic qualifiers.

India's men ensured it was a double home celebration in Bhubaneswar by overpowering Russia 7-1 in their second leg match, a result which gave them an 11-3 victory on aggregate. The home favourites conceded inside the opening 25 seconds as Russia closed the aggregate score-line to 4-3, but India moved through the gears to claim an emphatic win and seal their place at Tokyo 2020.

FIH HOCKEY PRO LEAGUE 2020



INDIA VS NETHERLANDS (18-19 JAN 2020)

India made it five points from a possible six points on the opening weekend of the men's FIH Hockey Pro League, with the hosts fighting back from 3-1 down against the Netherlands to tie the match before winning the shoot-out in a wonderful encounter at Bhubaneswar's Kalinga

Hockey Stadium. The home favourites – 5-2 winners against the Dutch in the first match - had the better of the early chances, but it was the Netherlands who took a 3-1 lead into half time thanks to quick-fire strikes from Mink van der Weerden, Jeroen Hertzberger and Bjorn Kellerman just before the break. A yellow card tenminute suspension for captain Manpreet Singh saw India play most of the third quarter with ten players, but somehow managed to avoid conceding before Mandeep Singh and Rupinder Singh netted in the fourth quarter to send the match to a shoot-out for the bonus point. Vivek Prasad, Gurjant Singh and Akashdeep Singh successfully converted their opportunities in the one-on-ones, giving India a 3-1 shoot-out victory to thrill the home fans at the Kalinga Stadium.





FIH HOCKEY PRO LEAGUE 2020

INDIA VS BELGIUM (08-09 FEB 2020)

Aggressive play by Indian Men's Hockey Team ensured they beat World No.1 Belgium 2-1 in a thrilling encounter to keep up their winning form in the FIH Hockey Pro League 2020. It was goals by Mandeep Singh (2') and Ramandeep Singh (46') that saw India gain the winning points against the World Champions at the iconic Kalinga Hockey Stadium in Bhubaneswar.World No.1 Belgium came-up with a dominant performance to beat India 3-2 in their second match at the FIH Hockey Pro League 2020. It was goals by Alexander Hendrickx (3'), Maxime Plennevaux (17' & 26') that ensured Belgium's victory while goals by Vivek Sagar Prasad (15'), Amit Rohidas (17') kept India in the hunt till the final hooter.

INDIA VS AUSTRALIA (21-22 FEB 2020)

India men produced a near-perfect shoot-out performance to steal a bonus point in the 2nd Match of their double-header against Australia, with the hosts emerging 3-1 winners in the one-on-ones after regular time finished 2-2 at the Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneswar. The result leaves the two teams locked together on ten points, with thirdplaced Australia ahead in of fourth-placed India in the standings by virtue of a superior goal difference. Australia - deserving 4-3 winners against India in 1st Match on Friday (21 February) – opened the scoring midway through the second quarter thanks to Trent Mitton's powerful slap-shot that somehow squeezed between India goalkeeper Krishan Pathak and his near post. However, the home favourites turned the match on its head with two penalty corner goals in three minutes, with Rupinder Singh and Harmanpreet Singh putting India 2-1 up at half time before Australia's Aran Zalewski leveled matters early in the fourth quarter.











INTERNATIONAL EVENTS - WOMEN'S (2019-20)







The Indian Women's Team Tour of Malaysia saw them win the Series against Malaysia. In the following months, the team defeated the home side Japan in the final to win the FIH Women's Series Finals. This helped the team qualify for the FIH Olympic Qualifiers.

While the team beat Japan, drew with Australia and China in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics Test Event in August, they won a match, drew three and lost a match against Great Britain during their tour to England in September 2019.

The turning point of 2019 was in Bhubaneswar where the women's team played out a success FIH Olympic Qualifiers against USA.

In February 2020, the Indian Senior Women's Team toured New Zealand. During the tour, India beat the host nation as well the Great Britain 3-0 and 1-0 respectively. During the same tour, they lost two hard-fought matches against the host nation.

MALAYSIA TOUR (01-12 APR 2019)



An impressive Indian Women's Hockey team won the FIH Women's Series Finals Hiroshima 2019 after defeating hosts Japan 3-1 in the Final held at the Hiroshima Hockey Stadium. The Indian Eves was helped by an early goal from Captain Rani in the 3rd minute, A brace from Gurjit Kaur scored in the 45th and 60th minutes saw India register an emphatic victory. The World No. 9 Indian team had already qualified for the FIH Olympic Qualifiers 2019 after securing a place in the Final of the competition.




TOKYO 2020 WOMEN'S OLYMPIC TEST EVENT (17-22 AUGUST 2019)



The Indian Women's Hockey Team put up a brilliant performance at the Olympic Test Event in Tokyo as they defeated hosts Japan 2-1 in the Final to win the competition. Captain Rani seemed extremely pleased with the way the side played against the likes of Australia, China and Japan.


Striker Rani, who was named the Best Player at the FIH Women's Series Finals Hiroshima 2019, has been leading the Indian side for more than two years. India could not seal a direct place in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics after a heart-breaking loss to Japan in the Asian Games Final in 2018. However, the Indian side, who beat Japan in the Final of the FIH Women's Series Finals Hiroshima 2019 and Olympic Test Event, is confident of achieving their goal in the FIH Olympic Qualifiers.





ENGLAND TOUR (27 SEP - 04 OCT 2019)

The Indian Women's Hockey Team were held to a 2-2 draw by Great Britain in their last match of the Tour to England held in Marlow on 4 October. The Indian team ended the tour with another draw against a relatively stronger Great Britain side, performing exceptionally during the five matches as they won one, drew three and lost one match.





FIH HOCKEY OLYMPIC QUALIFIERS (01-02 NOVEMBER 2019)



India's women's team secured qualification for the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 on busy days of action in the FIH Hockey Olympic qualifiers. India's women came into their second leg match against USA with what looked like an unassailable 5-1 advantage, but a brilliant first-half performance saw the Americans score four times without reply to level the aggregate score at 5-5 against the hosts. However, a captain's goal from Rani Rampal in the final quarter gave India a 6-5 aggregate victory to break the hearts of a USA team that produced a truly monumental away performance in Bhubaneswar's Kalinga Stadium.









FIH HOCKEY OLYMPIC QUALIFIERS ODISHA

NEW ZEALAND TOUR (25 JAN - 05 FEB 2020)

The Indian Women's Hockey Team carried out a decent tour of New Zealand from 25 January 2020 to 05 February 2020. After getting off to a good start with a 4-0 win against the New Zealand Development squad in their first match, the Indian Women's Hockey Team lost 1-2 to hosts in a hard-fought match in their next fixture. India played out another high-octane clash in their next match but went down 0-1 against New Zealand. The Indian Women's Hockey Team returned to form after defeating Great Britain 1-0 in their fourth match of the tour and wrapped it up on a high with a 3-0 victory over hosts New Zealand. The Indian Women's Hockey Team Captain Rani was the top scorer of the tour with three goals.







INTERNATIONAL EVENTS - JR. MEN'S (2019-20)







The Indian Junior Men's Team started the 2019-20 season with an 8-Nations Tournament in Spain in June 2019 where the team finished sixth, competing against some of the best teams from across the world. The team also took part in the 9th Sultan of Johor Cup 2019 in October 2019, where they finished with the Silver Medal after losing out to Great Britain in the Final match for the second year in a row. The tour saw India defeat the likes of hosts Malaysia, New Zealand and Australia, which saw the Indian team progress to the Final match of the competition through impressive performances.

8 NATIONS TOURNAMENT (10-16 JUN 2019)

The Indian team managed just one win in the 8 Nations U-21 tournament in Spain. They started their campaign with a 4-0 loss to Australia and then went down 3-2 to Netherlands in their next match. India's woes continues as they went on to lose their third match 3-1 against Spain. The Indian team managed to get over the line against Austria with a 4-2 victory, but lost 2-1 to Great Britain in the 5th-6th classification match.





9[™] SULTAN OF JOHOR CUP (12-19 OCT 2019)



The Indian Junior Men's Hockey Team lost to Great Britain 2-1 in the Final of the 9th Sultan of Johor Cup in Johor Bahru on 19 October 2019. Right from the hooter it was India forcing the pace, and put Great Britain on the back foot. They were forcing the attacks, creating more circle penetrations but their finishing was letting them down.

Earlier in the competition, India defeated Malaysia (4-2), New Zealand (8-2) and Australia (5-1). They lost 3-4 to Japan and drew 3-3 against Great Britain in the round robin league-stage.

The Indian Junior Women's Team had a fantastic 2019-20, with the highlight of their season being the epic victory in their 3-Nations Tournament against Australia and New Zealand in November-December 2019 in Canberra. 




3 NATIONS TOURNAMENT (03-08 DECEMBER 2019)

India defeated New Zealand twice (2-0 and 4-1), while drew 1-1 with Australia earlier in the tournament.












FIH OUTDOOR RANKING (MEN'S)





Hockey India launched a meticulouslydesigned coaching certification programme; Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway in March 2019 with an aim to provide Certification to those candidates who are already Coaches or want to choose to become a coach in the sport of Hockey from the grassroots through to a high performance / international level. In its initial year, the initiative from Hockey India attracted an overwhelming response from across the country, with over 500 candidates getting benefitted for each of the three phases of the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway, which were held in March, August and December 2019. The Pathway is divided into seven levels: HI Level 'Basic', HI Level '1', HI Level '2', FIH Level '1', FIH Level '2', FIH Level '3' and FIH High Performance. These are elementary courses for the FIH Academy Coaching courses. Candidates who successfully clear the HI Level 'Basic', HI Level '1' and HI Level '2' Coaching Course will be eligible to enrol for FIH Academy Level '1'Coaching Course.

In an official announcement, the international governing body also announced that the competition will be played towards the end of 2021. The competition, which features the best young U-21 level talent from across the world, will again be heading to India, which won accolades from around the world for TAR PRADESH GOVERNMENT hosting one of the best FIH Senior Men's Hockey World Cups in 2018 held at the Kalinga Hockey Stadium, Bhubaneswar. After having hosted the FIH Junior Men's World Cup in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh in 2016, where India lifted the coveted trophy, India will again be hosting the biggest Junior-level competition in hockey. The FIH Junior Men's

World Cup will see a total of 16 teams compete for the

title, out of which six will be from Europe, four from Asia including hosts India, two from Africa,

two from Oceania and two

from Pan America. Out of the 16 teams, the six European teams who have already qualified for the event in India are -Germany, England, Netherlands, Spain, Belgium and France, as they secured their berths through performances in the European Continental Championships which were held in 2019. Reigning Champions India had defeated Belgium 2-1 in the Final match of the 2016 edition at the Major Dhyan Chand Stadium in Lucknow. which saw them lift their second-ever FIH Junior Men's World Cup. These seven High Performance Hockey Centres will be set-up under the Khelo India scheme, and will adhere to the expert professional training, utilization of sports science, and education of the young athletes, who will be enrolled into these Zonal High Performance Hockey Centres. Owing to the large hockey-playing population in and around these seven cities and availability of infrastructure, SAI and Hockey India has strategically shortlisted these centres as the first seven High Performance Hockey Centres in the country, and will further be identifying other suitable centres around the country which can be converted into High Performance Centres in the future.

The existing SAI Centres and Hockey Academies around India will serve as 'feeder' Centres to these new High Performance Hockey Centres, which shall hold 72 Men and 72 Women hockey players at each location. These young hockey players will be selected from a specific age range of 14 to 24 years in order to ensure that they are developed and prepared in time for the 2024 and 2028 Olympics.

The initial seven High Performance Hockey Centres will be established at the following locations:

- 1. SAI Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka (South Zone)
- 2. Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium, New Delhi (North Zone)
- 3. SAI Sundergarh, Odisha (East Zone)
- 4. SAI UDMCC, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh (Central Zone)

Followed by:

- 5. SAI NS NEC, Takyel, Imphal, Manipur (North-East Zone)
- 6. Balewadi Sports Complex, Pune, Maharashtra (West Zone)
- 7. SAI Centre, Ranchi and Gomke Jaipal Singh Astroturf Hockey Stadium (East Zone II)

The SAI Centre Bengaluru will remain as the main site for the Senior and Junior National Teams.





"This is a modest gift from Hockey India through a request made by the High Commission here. We hope it will help develop hockey.


"Hockey is a beautiful game and very popular in India. This is a start of our relationship with sports authorities in this country," he said.
