The year of 2016 ended on a high note for Indian Hockey. The month of October ended with the 5th Sultan of Johor Cup where the Indian Colts showed immense character and earned the runner's up spot. The Junior Men's team ended the year on a high note for them with an excellent performance at the 8th Junior Men's Asia Cup with a historic win over Pakistan in the Final. This was followed by the return of Neil Hawgood as the Chief Coach of the Indian Women team and the Argentina tour which proved to be a preparation ground for the Rio Olympics 2016.

The end of November witnessed India host Australia in a test series at Rajnandgaon and Raipur before the Hockey World League Finals where the Indian team gave a tough fight to the world champions Australia. This was followed by the Hockey World League finals which saw India making history with a scintillating performance to win the Bronze Medal defeating Netherlands under the guidance of Chief Coach Roelant Oltmans. This was on top of India rising upto the 6th rank in the FIH World Rankings.

The Indian Men team toured New Zealand in October 2015 to play two matches with the New Zealand A team and four match test series with the New Zealand team. The team scored a resounding 2-0 win in first two games against New Zealand A and secured a series win against the New Zealand national team 2-1 in a fourmatch series.

The team returned with many positives that gave them a boost of confidence for the upcoming FIH Hockey World League Final, which was held in Raipur, India in December 2015.

Speaking about the performance, Roelant Oltmans, Director High Performance and Chief Coach Men, Hockey India said, "The team performed exceptionally well in the New Zealand Tour which proves that our players are ready to take on greater challenges. The highlight was that we played an attacking game throughout the tour and did not lose our possession easily which will definitely boost our preparations for the FIH Hockey World League Final scheduled to take place towards the end of this year, I hope the team do its best and display high-level performances."

Captain Sardar Singh said, "We are in high spirits after the historic series win against a team which is ranked higher to us and the team has shown that they are ready to take on tougher opponents. After losing the first game against New Zealand, our team did not lose its focus and managed to win the series which proves that the team has the nerves of steel. Harmanpreet Singh became the highest scorer with four goals in the match taking his tournament tally to 15 goals. Harmanpreet Singh was awarded the Highest Scorer of the Tournament and Vikas Dahiya was awarded the Best Goalkeeper of the Tournament. Hockey India in recogniation of the achievement, announced a cash prize of Rs 1 Lakh each for the players and the Coach and a cash prize of Rs 50,000 for the remaining coaches and support staff. In addition prizes of Rs 1 Lakh each were announced for Harmanpreet Singh the Highest Scorer of the Tournament and Vikas Dahiya the Best Goalkeeper of the Tournament.



Senior Women Olympic 2016 Preparatory tour to Argentina

The Indian Women's team has been on a high this year winning the second round of the Hockey World League earlier in the year which was held in Delhi. The team gained 5th position in the Hockey World League Semi Final by the virtue of which they qualified for the Rio Olympics for the first time in 36 years.

The tour of Indian Women's team played against Argentina's under 21 women's team on 23rd November. The tournament earned the much needed international exposure as part of the teams preparations for the upcoming Rio Olympics.

"The team had been practicing together since the camp started with an aim in putting excessive emphasis on team work and the new team of Coaches and Support Staff are working hard to increase the work rate of each player, with the experienced Captain at the hlem to lead by example. The qualifications for the Olympics has been a boost and we will be playing in similar conditions to that of Rio which will give advantage in Olympic campaign. I have full faith in the girls and I hope we will put up a good show together," said Neil Hawgood, Chief Coach, Indian Women's Hockey team.

Ritu Rani, Captain, Indian Woman Hockey Team said, "We are aware about the nations expectations from us since we have qualified for the Olympics. We have been training hard and such international trips will only help us understand the results of our hard work before we represent our country in the Olympics next year. We are happy to have the best coaching facility and we feel confident about our preparation."







Dr. Narinder Dhruv Batra, President, Hockey India said, "The Women's have showcased what they are capable of with their recent achievements. Qualifying for the Olympics for the first time in 36 years is by itself a huge testimony to their hunger to succeed and capabilities. 








































Unveiling of The Hero Hockey World League Final Trophy

FIH Formally Writes To IOA Recognizing Hockey India As The National Federation of India for Men & Women

In continuation to the decision made by the Court of Arbitration for Sports (CAS) based out of Lausanne, Switzerland, on 17th September 2015, the International Hockey Federation (FIH) had formally written a letter to the Indian Olympic Association earlier requesting them to remove all reference of the IHF from their records and website. FIH had approved Hockey India (HI) during the FIH Congress in November 2014 as the National Federation of India. This decision was later appealed by the Indian Hockey Federation to CAS, and CAS confirmed this decision to reinstate HI as the official governing body for the sport of hockey in India. Hockey India came into existence in the year 2009 and ever since Indian hockey has only seen positive changes. Prestigious international events such as the FIH Champions Trophy, Olympic Qualification, and FIH Hockey World League Tournaments are some of the events that Hockey India has hosted in India giving the

Hockey India through the highly successful Hockey India League has taken the sport to the next level creating aspiration amongst youngsters to make a career in the sport and helping unearth fresh talent. The Hockey India League has not only helped Indian hockey but also has attracted many international stars. In the past few years Hockey India has only helped India become a prominent destination in the global hockey map.

Hockey India Admits Hockey Coorg As Associate Member

Hockey India, the apex body governing the sport in India has admitted Hockey Coorg as an Associate Member from the state of Karnataka. With the formation of Hockey Coorg, the region can now participate in the National Championships as a separate team, helping India unearth a larger pool of talent for the future.




Indian Men's Hockey Team Rises To 6th Position In The FIH Rankings

India moved up 2 places to the 6th position according to the updated International Hockey Federation (FIH) ranking released on 6th of November after the conclusion of all five Continental Championships. It is for the first time India has been ranked so high in the rankings. The upgrade in the ranking has come on account of the good performances from India in 2105 and qualification for the Rio Olympics.
