Headquartered in New Delhi, Hockey India was established on 20th May, 2009 and is affiliated to the International Hockey Federation (FIH), the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and Asian Hockey Federation (AHF).

Committed to the development of Hockey in the country, Hockey India with the assistance of Sports Authority of India and Department of Sports, Government of India, trains players at sub-junior, junior and senior level. The governing body engages in Coaching the coaches with International Standard certification programs, educates and equips technical officials and umpires to find a foothold in international arena, provides world-class infrastructure and International exposure for the players besides regular international competition.

Hockey India has also pioneered in bringing top International hockey events to India such as the FIH Men's World Cup in 2010 and 2018, FIH Champions Trophy in 2014, FIH Junior Men's World Cup in 2016, FIH Hockey World League Final in 2017. Hockey India will also be hosting the FIH Junior World Cup 2021 (Men) and the FIH Men's World Cup 2023. With its vision to popularize the game and constantly promote it, Hockey India is dedicated to getting our national team (both men and women) into the top three in the world.

OVERVIEW

The year 2020 posed challenges like no other. With the pandemic led nationwide lockdowns disrupting lives, the Tokyo Olympic Games postponed and training of national teams & competitions within the country and abroad coming to grinding halt, Hockey India wasted no time to reinvent and use the power of technology to ensure programs such as the Hockey India Coaches Education Pathway, the umpires and technical officials courses continued uninterrupted.

The virtual sessions, in fact, enabled more candidates to enrol and part-take to enhance their skills and knowledge of the game. The National Federation utilised this time to ensure all State Member Units used to the Hockey India Member Unit portal to register new players, coaches, technical officials.

Hockey India donated Rs 1.00 crore to the PM-CARES fund to tackle the worsening COVID-19 pandemic in the country in the month of April 2020. Hockey India further announced a contribution of Rs 21.00 Lakh towards the Odisha Chief Minister's Relief Fund in order to help the hockey-loving state in the wake of the pandemic in the same month.

Hockey India, having issued the SOPs to State Member Units as early as May 2020, and also providing detailed SOPs for the National Teams, ensured the teams are well-prepared to re-start training once allowed by the MHA, MYAS and SAI. This proactiveness ensured no time was lost in terms of getting the national teams back in camp, including the junior squads who were called up for National Camp by September 2020.

Hockey India further pursued opportunities for the national teams to tour for exposure tournaments and after connecting with almost every top hockey-playing National Federation, they successfully organising Tour of Argentina for the Indian Women's Team in January 2021 while the Men's Team toured Europe in February. The Junior Women's Team too successfully toured Chile and returned victorious while their male counterparts had resumed training in SAI, Bengaluru.

Hockey India also announced the resumption of the domestic calendar with the 11th edition of Hockey India National Championships starting in March 2021. They also conducted the inaugural edition of Hockey India Junior and Sub-Junior National Championships for Academies.

The team secured a big (6-1) win against home team Germany in their first match followed by a 1-1 draw against Germany. They followed it up with a 1-1 draw against Great Britain and ended the tour with a fantastic 3-2 win against Great Britain to remain unbeaten in the tour. These matches have undoubtedly set the momentum for the team in the Olympic Year and have surely begun the year on a positive note.

Indian Men's Hockey Team ended their Tour of Europe with a splendid 3-2 win against Great Britain on 08 March 2021. In the four-match tour, India secured a 6-1 win and 1-1 draw against Germany in Krefeld. They followed this up with a 1-1 draw and 3-2 win against Great Britain in Antwerp, Belgium. The Indian Team remained unbeaten in the 4-match Europe tour clinching a victory each against Germany and Great Britain.

ODISH



The year 2020 was as hard on the Indian Women's Hockey Team as it was on their male counterparts with all of them being restricted to a bio-bubble in SAI Centre, Bengaluru away from their families for many months, the team utilised this time to hone their skills and improve themselves in pursuit of success at the Tokyo Olympic Games. They viewed the postponement of the prestigious games as an opportunity to get better and stronger and have been headed in that direction, having secured positive outcomes when they toured Argentina and Germany to play matches against top ranked nations in world hockey.

After being out of action for almost one year after their tour of New Zealand in 2020, the Indian Women's Hockey Team travelled to Argentina in January 2021 for their first tour post the start of the Covid-19 pandemic. The Indian Women's Team registered scores of 2-2 & 1-1 against Argentina (Junior Women), 1-2 & 2-3 against Argentina (Women B) and 2-3, 0-2 and 1-1 against the Argentina Senior Women's team.

Following their tour of Argentina, the Indian Women's Team travelled to Germany for their second tour of the year. They registered scores of 0-5, 0-1, 0-2 & 1-2 in their four encounters against Germany in February-March 2021.



ARGENTINA TOUR 2021 (03 JAN - 04 FEB 2021)





The Indian Women's Hockey Team put up a determined performance to end their campaign in Argentina with a 1-1 draw on 31 January 2021. Earlier in the tour, India had drawn 2-2, 1-1 against the Argentina Junior team and lost 1-2, 2-3 to Argentina 'B' team. Against the Argentina Senior side, India lost 2-3 and 0-2 in the first and second matches.







GERMANY TOUR 2021 (23 FEB - 05 MAR 2021)

The Indian Women's Hockey Team concluded their tour of Germany with a 1-2 defeat in the fourth and final match in Dusseldorf on 04 March 2021. The Indian Women's Hockey Team went down 0-5, 0-1 and 0-2 in their first three matches of the tour.

CHILE TOUR (09 - 25 JAN 2021)

The Indian Junior Women's team won five of six matches played during their Tour of Chile, with one match ending in a draw. They started their tour by playing against Chile Junior Women's Team, both of which ended in India's favour with score-lines of 5-3 and 4-2 respectively. The Junior Eves continued their fine of form as their wins in the opening matches were backed by three wins in four matches against the Chile Senior team. The score-lines against Chile Senior team were 3-2, 2-2, 2-0 and 2-1.

After a few uncertain months due to the Covid-19 situations, the Indian Junior Men's Team resumed their activities with a Training and Conditioning Camp, which started in October 2020 and ended in January 2021.

After a few days break, India Colts were brought back into the camp at SAI, Bangalore, with their focus pinned on the upcoming Junior Asia Cup 2021 and the marquee event FIH Junior Hockey World Cup (Men) 2021 which is scheduled to take place in India. The 37-member core probable group are making the most out of the National Camp.



Hockey India thanks the Organising Committee of each of the National Championships for carrying out a fabulous job of ensuring that all matches were held in a safe and secure environment.


















STEEL CITY ROURKELA GEARS UP TO **HOST THE FIH ODISHA MEN'S HOCKEY WORLD CUP INDIA 2023**



A delegation of senior officials from Odisha, Hockey India and President FIH made the visit to Rourkela, Odisha on 11th December 2020, to assess the infrastructure work being carried out in the Steel City ahead of the FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup India 2023.

Hon'ble Minister for Sports and Youth Services, Odisha, Shri Tusharkanti Behera, Chief Secretary, Odisha, Shri. Asit Kumar Tripathy, International Hockey Federation (FIH) President, Dr. Narinder Department of Sports and Youth Services (DSYS), Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation of Odisha (IDCO), Hockey India (HI) and Sundergarh and Rourkela administration convened to review, assess and lay the road map, and systematically planned subsequent actions related to sports infrastructure development as per FIH standards and urban development involving large scale upgradation of Rourkela city.

During this visit, the officials took note of the airport upgradation work being carried out, as well as reviewed the medical and accommodation facilities in and around the city. The delegation also took note of the traffic, security and local transportation facilities between Bhubaneswar to Rourkela.

After the stupendous success of Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup in 2018 and the scale at which it was hosted, FIH had last year announced that the 2023 FIH Men's Hockey World Cup will be hosted in Odisha, for a second Bhubaneswar and Rourkela. After the Olympics, the Hockey World Cup is the most important tournament in world hockey and given the speed at which the preparations are underway, there is already huge excitement amongst hockey lovers from across the state of Odisha, especially from Sundergarh and Rourkela region.



HON'BLE ODISHA CHIEF MINISTER ANNOUNCED INDIA'S LARGEST HOCKEY STADIUM TO BE CONSTRUCTED IN ROURKELA



The wheels to host the prestigious FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup India 2023 started rolling in as the Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Naveen Patnaik on 24 December 2020 announced a new world class Hockey stadium in Rourkela city which would be the biggest stadium for Hockey in India with a sitting capacity of 20 thousand. This is going to redefine the sports landscape in the region.

The stadium along with the allied facilities will be developed as a benchmark for other Hockey stadiums around the world. Spread over 15 acres of land, the stadium will be constructed in the Biju Patnaik University of Technology campus, Rourkela.

Hockey players and people of Sundargarh district expressed their gratitude to the Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Naveen Patnaik for the State Government's initiative to build India's largest hockey stadium in Rourkela. The stadium will host hockey's greatest & finest during the FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup India 2023.

COUNTRY'S LARGEST HOCKEY STADIUM IN ROURKELA





The Odisha Chief Minister Shri Naveen Patnaik, on 16 February 2021, laid the foundation stone for the new world-class Hockey stadium to be constructed in Rourkela city which would be the biggest stadium for Hockey in India with a sitting capacity of 20,000.

The stadium is set to have all the modern facilities and will offer a unique experience to players and the fans during the 2023 FIH Men's Hockey World Cup. The work to develop synthetic hockey turf in each of the 17 blocks of Sundargarh district has already begun.

In 2023, the hockey-loving nation will host the competition for a record fourth time since its inception in 1971. The 2023 FIH Men's Hockey World Cup is slated to be held in Bhubaneswar and Rourkela from 13 January 2023 to 29 January 2023.

The 2023 FIH Men's Hockey World Cup being hosted in India holds great significance since India will be completing 75 years of independence in 2023. The host federation Hockey India did not want to miss out on the opportunity to showcase the growth of the sport in the country in this landmark year and give the country another reason to celebrate 75 years of independence.

When India hosted the 14th edition of Men's Hockey World Cup in 2018, all the matches of the competition were held at the Kalinga Hockey Stadium in Bhubaneswar, but two venues will be utilized for the FIH Men's Hockey World Cup in 2023 – Bhubaneswar and Rourkela.

"We are aiming to complete all the work required for hosting a successful FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup India 2023 by mid-2022. The upcoming World Cup is expected to be even bigger than the one in 2018. It will be

a challenge and an opportunity for us to organize the 2023 World Cup in two venues -Bhubaneswar and Rourkela. Since the World Cup in 2018 was held at the Kalinga Hockey Stadium in Bhubaneswar, most of the arrangements are in place in Bhubaneswar, while a new world-class Hockey stadium is built in Rourkela. World-class being infrastructure at both venues will enable Odisha to once again deliver a successful and memorable tournament and leave behind a valuable and lasting legacy," said Hon'ble Minister for Sports and Youth Services, Odisha, Shri. Tusharkanti Behera.

Speaking on the preparations for the 2023 FIH Men's Hockey World Cup, Mr. Gyanendro Ningombam, President, Hockey India, said "It's an absolute honour for us to host the Men's Hockey World Cups back-to-back. After hosting a successful World Cup in 2018, we are going to ensure that the FIH Men's Hockey World Cup in 2023 will have even better facilities for the players and the fans. It's very exciting to note that we are exactly two years away from the 2023 World Cup."

India has hosted some of the biggest hockey competitions in recent years including the FIH Champions Trophy in 2014, FIH Junior Men's World Cup in 2016, FIH Hockey World League Final in 2017, FIH Men's Series Finals in 2019 and the FIH Hockey Olympic Qualifiers in 2019. Smooth organization, world-class facilities, and the success of these tournaments have made India one of the major centres for hockey in the world. India will become the first country ever to host four Men's Hockey World Cups in 2023, after having hosted the Men's Hockey World Cups in 1982 (Mumbai), 2010 (New Delhi) and 2018 (Bhubaneswar). The national side will be looking to win the coveted title after their last win in 1975.





The Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway which was launched in March 2019, is a simplified education structure that aims to help in developing coaches from the grassroots level into world-class coaches of the high performance/international level. After getting a good response in the initial months, Hockey India ensured to continue this program despite the pandemic situations and the lockdown in 2020 as they came up with an innovative virtual format of it. The Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level 'Basic' Coaching Course (online) was successfully organized in September/ October and December last year, and February 2021. Hockey India, in close association with the International Hockey Federation (FIH), also organized the FIH Academy - Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course online for Indian Coaches. Soon after things getting back to normal, in March 2021, Hockey India, while following COVID-19 protocols and safety measures, conducted first on-ground Level '1' and Level '2' Coaching courses after almost a year's time. Since the launch of Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway in 2019, over 1000 coaches from across India have benefitted from the program which is a simplified education structure that consists of a combination of web-based modules and face-to-face interactive courses, underpinned by a competency-based assessment process, which helps the Coaches in progressing to higher levels.










ARJUNA AWARD - AKASHDEEP SINGH



> or the last four years, the India women's national field hockey team has dreamt and worked towards a single goal—to bring home an Olympic media and make India proud. The Indian forward had opened the scoring for India with 13 seconds on the clock with a superb breakaway goal, in a match which finished 5-2 in the favour of his team, and gave India a fantastic start to their FIH Hockey Pro League 2020 debut campaign. His goal was voted second, behind only Belgium's Ambre Ballenghien, and ahead of Argentina's Carla Rebecchi.

Indian Men's Hockey Team's superb 2-1 win over reigning World and European champions Belgium on 8th February, 2020 in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, was voted as the third best FIH Hockey Pro League match of 2020 by the fans on FIH's Watch. Hockey mobile app. The win, that helped India climb one spot to take the 4th position in the FIH World Rankings, came against a strong Belgium side which was ranked 2nd in the World Rankings. A nervy but thrilling encounter, which saw through Mandeep Singh, witnessed the visitors equalizing in the 33rd



minute through Gauthier Boccard. However, with just 14 minutes left on the clock, it was Forward Ramandeep Singh who scored the winner for India to pull off a memorable win for the Indian Men's Hockey team in front of a packed Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneswar.







TOP HIGHLIGHTS 2020-21

With life and sport around the world getting disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic, Hockey India left no stones unturned to bring back normalcy to the lives of its stakeholders. The major highlights are the resumption of sporting activities in India amid the pandemic situations. While adhering to the guidelines issued by Hockey India, the National team resumed their activities with a Camp in SAI Centre, Bengaluru.

When the country was under lockdown in March-April 2020, the members of the Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Teams carried out a series of exercises in their rooms, as a part of the workout from home series, to keep fit while they stayed away from the hockey pitch.

In April 2020, Hockey India became the first federation to layout and share detailed SOPs and guidelines for the resumption of sporting activities. Hockey India also organised a firstof-its kind Special Congress in May 2020 via video conference to engage with its Executive Board Members and State Member Units to discuss the way forward to restart the sport at state and national level following the Covid-19 pandemic situation.

After two months, in June 2020, Olympic Day was held digitally with activities that spread the message of spirit of sportsmanship and unity through hockey-focused activities including quizzes, wellness programs, art and craft competitions, write-ups and essays on Olympic Day and Olympic values, along with spreading awareness on the importance of healthy living, staying indoors and staying fit. In the same month, Hockey India made further improvements in the Hockey India Member Unit Portal by introducing an open application & registration process for Coaches and Technical Officials.

The Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Teams players also engaged with the hockey fans through a skills-challenge to celebrate the occasion of National Sports Day on Saturday, 29 August 2020 and several Hockey India Member Units participated in the #FitIndiaFreedomRun 2020 campaign in the last week of September to promote fitness and healthy lifestyle.

With October being the breast cancer awareness month globally, Hockey India and the non-profit organization Aaroogya for women cancer Research and Prevention conducted a session via Zoom with the members of the Indian Women's Hockey Team about the early detection and prevention of breast, cervical and oral cancer on 30 September 2020.

Following all the safety measures, the Governing Body for Hockey also held its 10th Hockey India Congress & Elections in New Delhi in November 2020 for the post of President.

Hockey India announce restructuring of National Championships from 2021

In an endeavour to maximise athlete participation and further develop hockey among the States, Union Territories/ NCTs, Departmental Units and Academy Members, the Hockey India Executive Board on 15th April 2020 announced that the Hockey India Annual National Championships 2021 will be restructured with dedicated events for the various Member Units as per the following: -

- 1. National Championships for Hockey India registered State Member Units only, for the categories Sub Junior, Junior & Senior National Championships for both Men and Women.
- 2. National Championships Hockey India registered Public Departmental Units only, for the categories Junior & Senior National Championships for both Men and Women.
- 3. National Championships for Hockey India registered Academy Member Units only, for categories Sub Junior & Junior National Championships for both Men and Women.

Furthermore, an athlete will only be eligible to represent his/her team in only one of the participate in one of the age-group categories i.e. Sub Junior or Junior or Senior to ensure that more athletes are given the opportunity to participate in India's top level domestic events.

in the Hockey India National Championships, it will be mandatory for each State Member to conduct their State Level Championships in each category i.e. Sub Junior/ Junior / Senior - Men and Women prior to the annual National Championships.

The previous system of hosting National Championships in A and B Division for various agegroups will no longer prevail but instead all State Members Units will compete in Sub-junior, Junior and Senior age-groups for Men and Women while all PSUs and Departmental Units will come under a separate category and compete among each other in Junior and Senior Category (Men and Women) and a third category that is exclusively for Academy Member Units who will compete in the Sub-Junior and Junior National Championships (Men and Women).





Hockey India & SAI collaborate for Coaches Development Sessions

In a bid to make use of the lockdown period to good effect, Hockey India and Sports Authority of India (SAI) on 18th April 2020 announced the introduction of the 21-day Coaches Development Sessions (CDS), as part of SAI's MOOC (Massive Open Online Course) workshop for coaches.



These online education Sessions started on 20th April 2020, and were aimed at providing high level knowledge to Hockey Coaches around the country through video conferencing. The Coaches Development Sessions were classified into two Coaching Sessions - Level 'Basic' Coaching Sessions and Level 'Intermediate' Coaching Sessions, and were conducted by Hockey India's Foreign National Team Coaches, Scientific Advisors and Director, High Performance.

Hockey India conducts training & interactive sessions for Umpires & Technical Officials via WhatsApp

Hockey India on 20th April 2020 announced that it has initiated interactive sessions through WhatsApp for Indian Umpires and Technical Officials in order to utilize the lockdown period to improve their officiating knowledge and motivate each other on fitness



matters. A team of experienced Technical Delegates and Umpire Managers were conducted these interactive sessions across six WhatsApp groups with the goal to guide and motivate the officials to raise the level of officiating and also to maintain their fitness levels. Further, a total of 30 Hockey India Member Units also conducted interactive sessions for Technical Officials and Umpires across their respective regions.

Workout from Home Series

During the lockdown, experienced Indian players, men and women, showed how one can keep fit at home. Players including Captain Rani, PR Sreejesh, Harmanpreet Singh, Navneet Kaur showed how they were keeping fit despite the lack of match practice. Rani showed off her ball control skills using a hockey stick while Sreejesh explained how one could stay fit with even without a gym or a turf.

Lalit Upadhyay displayed some pull up routines while Navneet used her skipping skills to good effect. Harmanpreet and Kothajit Singh introduced a variety of challenging push-up drills one could use at home.





Hockey India became the first NSF to issue SOPs

Hockey India became the first federation to share a detailed SOPs and guidelines for the resumption of hockey activities with all member units with the intent to be well prepared and ready for systematic rollout.

Hockey India, in the Special Congress in May, engaged it's Executive Board Members and State Member Units in valuable discussions to pave the way forward and re-start the sport at state and national level following the COVID-19 pandemic situation.



The 20-page dossier to it's Member Units provided a minimum standard to be followed when hockey activities resume in their respective states. The SOPs includes educating the athletes, sanitising the entire facility prior to any event as well as encouraging all participants to share their details not just with organisers but also with health authorities. The guidelines also include pre-event, during-event and post-event protocols to follow. It also covers important procedures to follow when teams have to travel for domestic competition.

A copy of the SOP document is also available on the Hockey India website.



Hockey India played pivotal role in helping state units resume sporting activities

Following the issuance of MHA orders in September 2020, Hockey India staff were in continuous touch with the 31 State Member Units to guide them through the process of resumption of their State & District level training programmes as a proactive measure to help ease the process for them. To further enhance the confidence of the State Units administration staff to resume sporting activities once their respective states issues guidelines to re-open sporting programs, Hockey India conducted an interactive session with Chief Coaches of the national teams and experienced national players; PR Sreejesh and Savita to further explain the micro-level precautions that could be followed while adhering to the Guidelines issued by Hockey India for a safe return to sporting activities.

The session illustrated this process by sharing the first-hand experience of how the National Camp coaches and players are following the set protocol being in the camp which is being held in a bio-bubble. Through the webinar, officials from each of the Hockey India Member Units got a fair idea of the precautions that need to be taken by the players on the field such as doing drills in small groups, regular hand sanitization, making a training schedule which builds the intensity steadily over time, regular temperature checks including the precautions to be taken while using shared equipment, so on. These initiatives taken from Hockey India helped states resume activities in a safe manner.





Hockey India conducts Hockey India Level 'Basic' Coaching Course online for **Senior Core Probables**

In a bid to make use of the lockdown period, Hockey India conducted the Hockey India Level 'Basic' Coaching Course for the Senior Core Probables, who were stationed at the SAI Centre in Bengaluru. The Course saw a total of HOCKEYINDIA 32 Senior Men and 23 Senior Women Core Probables





take part, the sessions of which were conducted online by Hockey India. Captain of the Indian Women's Team Rani had already attended the Hockey India Coaching Education pathway in the past and achieved a Hockey India Level '1' Coach Certification.

Hockey India added more structure to the gradation of Hockey India **Tournament Officials for better** performance


In May 2020, Hockey India announced the launch of classification of the Hockey India registered Tournament Officials which included Technical Delegate, Umpire Managers, Technical Officers, Judges and Umpires into three grades - Hockey India Grade 1, Hockey India Grade 2 and Hockey India Grade 3.

The grading was done out of 100, (percentage-wise) with emphasis for umpires being based on Performance reports (from all domestic tournaments), Fitness Test results and Online Test results whereas for Technical Officials it will be based on Performance reports (from all domestic tournaments) and Online Test results.

The appointment of Officials for domestic matches throughout India were done on the basis of the updated gradation of Officials. The Umpires/Officials, who produce excellent results in India Grade 1 and so on.

Further, any new interested Tournament Officials can have a chance to join the Hockey India Potential List, once they are reviewed after being nominated by the Hockey India Member Units. To be in contention for the nomination, the Official must be below 25 years in case of Umpires and below 35 years in case of Technical Officials, should have passed the HI online tests, must have minimum two years of experience in state and district championships and shall be nominated by their state member units. The nominations can only be made through the Hockey India Member Unit Portal via the official registration process which began from 01 July 2020.

Hockey India makes modifications to the assessment of Officials Performance Report Templates for Tournament Officials and Umpires

Hockey India has made further modifications to the assessment of Officials Performance Report Templates including Tournament Officials and Umpires.

The result in the Performance report is one of the key factors for the assessment of the work carried out by the Tournament Officials and Umpires in domestic tournaments in India. Along with the current evaluation criteria in the Officials Performance Report Templates for Tournament Officials, a new updated Umpire Assessment Match Report has been added. The performance of the Umpires will be assessed in each and every match they are officiating and the Umpire Managers will share their reports with the Umpires and Hockey India after their respective matches are completed. It will also be utilized during the umpires debriefing and the Umpire Managers will ensure that the Umpires learn and improve after every match and don't commit the same errors.

The assessment match reports will serve as the basis for the appointment of the Umpire in the final phases of a particular tournament and shall also help Hockey India ensure that the best performing Umpires will officiate in the Semi-Finals and Finals of the particular tournament. The Umpire's performance will be monitored efficiently, leading to the justified selection of umpires during the crucial stages of a tournament. These modifications will contribute to improving the standard of Umpiring and Officiating in India. Hockey India conducted an online workshop for all Hockey India registered Technical Delegates and Umpire Managers on 27th June 2020 and 28th June 2020 which ensured standardisation of assessment of Officials which will be a better and more efficient method to effectively mark the official's performance through Performance Reports.

Hockey India conducted Online Workshop for Technical Delegates & Technical Officers

After having conducted an online workshop for all Hockey India registered Technical Delegates and Umpire Managers to ensure standardization on assessment of Officials, Hockey India on 26 July 2020 organized another online workshop for the Hockey India registered Technical Delegates and Technical Officers to ensure continuation in the development process of the participating Technical Officials.

The online workshop took place through video conferencing and was conducted by FIH World Panel/FIH Pro League Technical Official & Certified FIH Academy Educator, Mr. Moghul Mohammed Muneer. It was attended by a total of 22 candidates which consisted of Hockey India registered Technical Delegates and experienced Technical Officers, and focused majorly on the preparation of Match Schedule by the Technical Officials as per the FIH Competition Policies And Procedures.

International Hockey Federation (FIH) organize Facilities workshop for Hockey **India State Member Units**

The Facilities and Quality Programme Manager at the International Hockey Federation (FIH) Alastair Cox conducted a very productive Facilities workshop for Hockey India State Member Units through Microsoft Teams on Thursday, 09 July 2020. One representative from each of the Hockey India's 31 State Member Units got an opportunity to understand the basics of developing a facilities



strategy, understand the different field and surfacing options and identify additional features to consider when planning a new hockey facility during the course of the three-hour workshop.

The Facilities and Quality Programme Manager stressed on the topics relevant to India including academy venues during the workshop. Hockey India extended this opportunity to its registered 31 State Member Units with one representative allowed from each of the State Member Units to attend the workshop.

State Member Units constitute Masters Committee within their respective **States**

After Hockey India joined 38 other National Associations from around the world as a member of the World Masters Hockey (WMH) in March 2020, Hockey India State Member Units in November 2020 formed their respective Masters Committee to further carry out responsibilities at the State Level to promote and further develop Masters Hockey across the country.

The Hockey India Masters Committee, which will be overseeing all matters related to these Masters matches and tournaments at the National level in India, is headed by Mr. Harbinder Singh as the Chairman of the Committee, Dr. RP Singh as the Convener, with Members including former India players Mr. BP Govinda, Mr. Jagbir Singh, Dr. AB Subbaiah, Ms. Surinder Kaur and Ms. M Renuka Lakshmi.

As per the guidelines set by Hockey India Masters Committee, the state member units through their respective committees will be responsible to ensure all the Masters athletes of various age categories are registered on the Hockey India Member Units Portal. Some of the Committee members of the State Member Units include the likes of former India Captain Pargat Singh, Mir Ranjan Negi, Gurbux Singh, Birbahadur Chettri among many others. By having a proper Hockey India Masters Committee with the mandate to encourage, plan and execute various Masters hockey events in the country, it gives former players and people from all age groups and both genders the chance to deep-dive once again into the adrenaline rush that comes with playing their favourite sport.



Hockey India introduces Open Application & Registration system for Players, Coaches and Technical Officials

Hockey India, which has utilized the Hockey India Member Unit Portal since September 2019 to manage all their important documentation, registration of players, player transfers, national championships, Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway, registration of coaches and technical officials, have introduced some new key features to the Hockey India Member Unit Portal. The Hockey India Member Unit Portal is a major step towards going paperless and making data easily accessible. All the activities carried out by all Hockey India Member Units are documented on the Portal.

Hockey India on 01 July 2020 launched an open application submission system for registration of Coaches and Technical Officials. Any candidate can submit their application for further approval of Hockey India's registered Member Unit to register as a Coach or Technical Official through the open link that was circulated via the media and social media.

Once a candidate submits his/her application, he or she would need the approval of the concerned Hockey India registered Member Unit under which a Coach or Technical Official is submitting the application. Once the application is approved by the Hockey India Member Unit, the application would require the final approval of Hockey India prior to the confirmation of registration of a Coach or Technical Official.

On 07 January 2021, Hockey India introduced an open application and registration process for players under various categories, similar to the open application and registration process for Coaches and Technical Officials. Any hockey player across the country can submit their application for further approval of Hockey India Registered Member Unit to register as a player through the Hockey India Member Unit Portal.











Hockey India celebrated Olympic Day 2020, National Sports Day 2020 & FIT India Freedom Run 2020 by bringing hockey community together digitally






10TH HOCKEY INDIA CONGRESS AND ELECTIONS




Hockey India Umpires & Technical Officials Online Workshop 2020-2021



HOCKEY INDIA CARES

Hockey India donated Rs 1.00 crore to the PM-CARES fund to tackle the worsening COVID-19 pandemic in the country in the month of April 2020. Hockey India further announced a contribution of Rs 21.00 Lakh towards the Odisha Chief Minister's Relief Fund in order to help the hockey-loving state in the wake of the pandemic in the same month.

In an effort to help the poor and migrant workers whose livelihood was affected due to the nationwide lockdown in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Indian women's hockey team raised a whopping Rs 20,01,130 to feed more than 1000 families. The Indian team had launched an 18-day fitness challenge between 17 April - 3 May 2020 to raise funds for the charity. The movement also encouraged people to use this opportunity to adapt to an active lifestyle during the lockdown. The challenge involved the members of the women's team who came up with different fitness tasks that ranged from burpees, lunges, squats to spider man pushups, pogo hops and more. Each day a player came up with a new challenge and tagged 10 people on their social media handles. They, in turn, would take up the challenge and donate Rs 100 to the fundraiser.

In August last year, Hockey India announced it will provide 61 unemployed players, including 34 women, with financial assistance amid the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, to help them return to sporting activities. Athletes not holding employment were facing constraints due to the pandemic, impacting them adversely. Under the initiative, each player was provided a sum of Rs 10,000. Through this initiative, Hockey India was keen to find a way to give players affected during the pandemic some immediate relief. A sum of Rs 10,000 each as financial assistance meant they would not add any additional burden on their families as they looked to resume sports activities later that year. The objective of the initiative was to provide basic financial relief to the athletes.

Fight against Covid-19: Hockey India total contribution of Rs. 1.00 Crore/Rs. 100.00 Lakhs for the PM Cares Fund

In a big step towards helping India's fight against Covid-19 Pandemic, Hockey India announced a total of Rs. 1.00 Crore/Rs. 100.00 Lakhs towards the PM Cares Fund. The objective is to provide basic financial relief for the athletes to be able to assist them to again resume sporting activities.




