

HOCKEY INDIA (HI) is the governing body with exclusive mandate to direct and conduct all activities for both Men and Women's Hockey in India. It is recognized by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India as the sole body responsible towards promoting Hockey in India.

Headquartered in New Delhi, Hockey India was established on 20th May 2009 and is affiliated to the International Hockey Federation (FIH), the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and Asian Hockey Federation (AHF).

Committed to the development of Hockey in the country, Hockey India with the assistance of Sports Authority of India and Department of Sports, Government of India, trains players at Sub–Junior, Junior and Senior level. The governing body engages in Coaching the coaches with International Standard certification programs, educates and equips technical officials and umpires to find a foothold in international arena, provides world-class infrastructure and International exposure for the players besides regular International competition.

Hockey India has also pioneered in bringing top International Hockey events to India such as the FIH Men's World Cup in 2010 and 2018, FIH Champions Trophy in 2014, FIH Junior Men's World Cup in 2016 and 2021, FIH Hockey World League Final in 2015 & 2017, FIH Hockey Pro League (2020–2021) / (2021–22). The apex body along with its Major Team Partner Odisha State Government is now gearing up to host the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar-Rourkela for the second consecutive time in the country. The prestigious quadrennial tournament is scheduled to be held from 13 January 2023 to 29 January 2023 at Bhubaneswar & Rourkela, Odisha.

With its vision to popularize the game and constantly promote it, Hockey India has brought the Indian Men's Hockey Team into the top three in the world. Hockey India is also dedicated to getting the Indian Women's Hockey Team into the top three in the world.

History was made in the year 2021–22 as the Indian Men's Hockey Team ended the 41–year Olympic Medal drought at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. After defeating Germany 5–4 in the Bronze Medal match, the Men's Team brought the entire nation to its feet to celebrate a momentous occasion. The Indian Women's Hockey Team also played a fantastic game against Great Britain in the Bronze Medal match, but unfortunately went down 3–4.

Even though the entire world was fighting against Covid-19 pandemic during 2021-22, Indian hockey continued to move forward. India once again showed that it is one of the best venues for Hockey when the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's Junior World Cup Bhubaneswar 2021 was held at the Kalinga Hockey Stadium in November-December 2021. The Indian Junior Team played exceedingly well in the tournament but unfortunately fell short in the Bronze Medal match, going down 1-3 to France.

Indian hockey also received a huge boost when, in August 2021, the Odisha State Government extended its partnership with the national teams for 10 more years. The Odisha State Government has been the Major Team Partner of the Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Teams since 2018.

The players at the domestic level have also received a brilliant opportunity to showcase their talent in a large number of National Championships held during the course of the last year. Some of the National Championships organized in 2021–22 include 11th Hockey India Senior Men National Championship, 11th Hockey India Senior Women National Championship 2021, 11th Hockey India Junior Men National Championship 2021 and 11th Hockey India Junior Women National Championship 2021.

The Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Teams have also enthralled the fans in the FIH Hockey Pro League. The Men's Team recorded wins against France, South Africa, Spain, Argentina, England and Germany and the Women's Team registered triumphs over China, Spain, Germany and Netherlands in the past year.

Buenos Aires, Argentina

06th to 14th April 2021

After their unbeaten Europe tour at the start of 2021, the Indian Men's Hockey Team got a golden opportunity of a six-match tour to Argentina in April 2021 amid pandemic challenges. Apart from four practice games, the Indian Men's Team played back-to-back FIH Hockey Pro League matches against the Rio Olympic Champions on April 11 and 12 (in 2021), which also marked their return to the top-level international competition after

more than a year. The Argentina tour helped the team build momentum for the Tokyo Olympics 2020, having won both their FIH Hockey Pro League matches against the hosts. The Indian team bagged 2–2 (3–2 SO) and 3–0 wins in the Pro League double-header and also registered two wins (4–3, 4–2), a 0–1 loss and a dramatic 4–4 draw in their four practice matches on the tour.

TOKYO OLYMPICS 2020

Tokyo, Japan

23rd July to 6th August 2021

History rewritten at Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 by Indian Men and Women's Hockey Team

It was a historic Olympic Games for the Indian Men and Women's hockey teams, despite several challenges they faced due to the pandemic in the lead up to the prestigious quadrennial event. While the Indian Men's Hockey Team led by Manpreet Singh ended 41-year long wait by clinching the Bronze medal after beating Germany 5-4 in the third placing match, the Indian Women won million hearts world over by finishing the Tokyo Olympics at an impressive fourth place.

Led by Rani, the Indian Women's Hockey Team put up an inspiring performance throughout the Tokyo Olympics 2020. After going down 5–1 to the Netherlands, 2–0 to Germany and 4–1 to Great Britain in their first three Group Stage matches in Pool A, the Indian eves bounced back in style in their last two Pool matches and registered victories against Ireland (1–0) and South Africa (4–3) to book a place in the Quarter–Finals.

Facing a formidable opponent in Australia in the knockout stage, the Indian team accepted the challenge head-on and went on to script history when they defeated the Australia to book a place in the Olympics Semi-Final for the first time. The Indian team put up a strong fight against Argentina in the Semi-Final, but couldn't manage to get past them as they suffered a narrow 2–1 loss. However, with a medal hope still alive, the Indian Women's Team played their hearts out in the Bronze Medal match against Great Britain, but, they couldn't achieve a podium finish after coming tantalizingly close. Great Britain; the then defending Olympic champions, registered a 4–3 victory over India to clinch a Bronze Medal.

Manpreet and Co. started their campaign with a 3–2 win against New Zealand, but lost 1-7 to Australia in their second match. The spirited Indian team responded to the setback in style as they went on to register consecutive wins against Spain (3-0), Argentina (3-1) and Japan (5-3) to finish second in Pool A of the prestigious tournament. They defeated Great Britain 3-1 in Quarter-Finals before losing 5-2 against Belgium in their historic Semi Final. However, they staged a remarkable comeback to bag a 5-4 win over Germany to clinch a historic Bronze Medal at Tokyo Olympic Games 2020.

Top Highlights from Tokyo Olympics 2020

Indian Men's Hockey Team get off to a winning start in Tokyo; beat New Zealand 3–2 in a battle of nerves





The Indian Men's Hockey Team got off to a rollicking start in their group stage campaign with a strong 3–2 win against New Zealand in a match that went down to the wire. While it was Rupinder Pal Singh who opened the scoreboard for India in the 10th minute, Harmanpreet Singh extended the lead in the 26th and 33rd minute but it was experienced goalkeeper PR Sreejesh who saved the day for India with excellent work in the goal post to stop New Zealand from converting an equaliser in the dying minutes of the match.

Indian Women's Hockey Team go down 5–1 in Tokyo Olympics opening match vs Netherlands





The Indian Women's Hockey Team fought valiantly against the World Number 1 Netherlands team in their first encounter of the Tokyo Olympics at the Oi Hockey Stadium. The Netherlands took the lead with an early goal in the 6th minute, however, India fought back and equalized the score in the 10th minute. After playing out a goalless second quarter, the Netherlands took complete control of the match and scored four goals in the second half to seal a 5–1 victory.

Ruthless Australia beat India 7-1 in the second Pool A Match





Coming off strong performances against New Zealand in the FIH Hockey Pro League ahead of their arrival in Tokyo, the World No.1 squad displayed formidable form to beat India 7-1 in their second Pool A match at the Oi Hockey Stadium.

Though India created two good PCs in the 8th and the 15th minute, neither could be converted. Dilpreet too made a brave foray into the circle in the 13th minute but didn't have enough support to finish the task. Even though India made 24 circle penetrations as opposed to 22 by Australia in the match, they could not muster breaching Australia's solid defence in the circle.

Indian Women's Hockey Team lose 0–2 to World Number 3 Germany





The Indian Women's Hockey Team played their hearts out in their second Tokyo Olympics encounter against the World Number 3 Germany side at the Oi Hockey Stadium. The Indian team had many chances to score, but couldn't find a way to get on board, before going down 0-2 against the Germans. In their second Pool A match. The Indians put more pressure on the Germans, but the German defense proved to be too strong.



Indian Men's Hockey team bounce back with 3–0 win over Spain in their third Tokyo Olympics Match





Following a 1–7 loss against Australia, the Indian Men's Hockey Team bounced back in style as they outclassed Spain 3–0 in their third match of the Tokyo Olympics 2020. India started off in an aggressive manner with a structured attack and dominated the possession in the early minutes. Challenging the opponent's defence, India made their moves in Spain's half and created potential goalscoring opportunities.

It was Rupinder Pal Singh (15', 51') and Simranjeet Singh (14') who scored for India while PR Sreejesh ensured a clean sheet to bring India's Olympics campaign back on track.

Missed opportunities leads Indian Women's Hockey Team to a 1–4 loss to Defending Olympic Champions Great Britain





The Indian Women's Hockey Team played out a hard-fought encounter against Great Britain in their third Pool A match of the Tokyo Olympics, which ended 4–1 in favour of the defending Olympic champions. The match saw free flowing attacking hockey being played by both sides, with World Number 5 side Great Britain emerging winners due to efficient chance conversion.

Goals from Hannah Martin (2', 19'), Lily Owsley (41') and Grace Balsdon (57') seal Great Britain's victory and Sharmila Devi (23') scored the solitary goal for India.

India beat hosts Japan 5–3 to finish second in Pool A





Continuing their winning momentum, the Indian Men's Hockey Team registered their third consecutive win in the round robin league stage at the Oi Hockey Stadium on 30 July 2021. The team led by Manpreet Singh beat hosts Japan 5-3 with goals scored by Gurjant Singh (17', 56'), Harmanpreet Singh (13'), Shamsher Singh (34') and Nilakanta Sharma (51'). Kenta Tanaka (19'), Kota Watanabe (33') and Kazuma Murata (59') were the goal scorers for Japan. With this victory, India were placed second in the Pool A table only behind World No.1 Australia.

Vandana Katariya scores a hat–trick as Indian Women's Hockey Team defeat South Africa 4–3





The Indian Women's Hockey Team kept their Tokyo Olympics Quarter-Finals hopes alive after defeating South Africa 4–3 at the Oi Hockey Stadium on 31 July 2021. Vandana Katariya (4', 17', 49') and Neha (32') found the back of the net for India and helped their team clinch 3 crucial points in the competition. India's place in the knock-out stage of the tournament was confirmed after the match between Ireland and Great Britain. After Great Britain defeated Ireland, India sealed a fourth place finish in Pool A.

With just a little over three minutes left on the clock, Rani, from the right, delivered a brilliant pass to Navneet, who tapped the ball into the goal and helped India go 1–0 up in the match. India continued to put pressure on their opponents in the last few minutes and ensured that they walked away from the pitch as the winners of the match.

The Indian Women's Hockey Team put up a valiant effort against Rio Olympics Gold Medallists Great Britain in the Tokyo Olympics Bronze Medal match at the Oi Hockey Stadium on 06 August 2021. The Great Britain side controlled most of the proceedings in the opening minutes of the match and took a 2-0 lead by the 24th minute. However, Gurjit Kaur (25', 26') and Vandana Katariya (29') struck three goals in quick succession to help India take the lead at 3-2 just before the half-time whistle. Great Britain regained the

momentum in the second half and scored a goal in each of the third and fourth quarters to seal a Bronze Medal at the Tokyo Olympic Games 2020.

Indian Men's Hockey Team end 41-year Olympic Medal drought

The date 05 August 2021 will be etched in Indian hockey fans' memories forever as the Indian Men's Hockey Team scripted a fantastic comeback against Germany to win the Bronze Medal at the Tokyo Olympics 2020. The Indian team was trailing 1–3 in the 25th minute, however, Hardik Singh (27'), Harmanpreet Singh (29'), Rupinder Pal Singh (31') and Simranjeet Singh (34') found the back of the net in quick succession to help their team take a lead at 5–3 in the 34th minute. The Germans found a breakthrough in the 48th minute, however, they couldn't equalize the score as the Indian Team went on to make history at the Oi Hockey Stadium.

Earlier in the game, Germany played out the first quarter with incredible pace in their attack and displayed their intent to put India on the backfoot right from the start. Tactical play inside India circle by Timm Herzbruch who pushed the ball to Florian Fuchs.

He in turn setup Timur Oruz to score Germany's first goal in the 2nd minute of the match. Though India had an opportunity to equalise in the 7th minute when they earned a PC but it was fired away wide from the target by Rupinder Pal Singh. India's goalkeeper Sreejesh, on the other hand, made a brilliant save in the 10th minute when he stopped Mats Grambusch from scoring a field goal to extend Germany's lead.

A charged-up German attacked continued to play with pace and precision testing India's defence all through the first quarter. They made yet another ambitious attempt at goal in the 12th minute through Johannes Grosse and in the 15th minute Germans used a referral just after the hooter to win their first PC. There were three retakes given following some brave blocking by Amit Rohidas in India's defence. Lukas Windfeder taking a flick could not convert from these chances.



The second quarter saw a flurry of goals being scored between the two teams. While India equalised in the 17th minute when a brilliant counterattack from India led by Nilakanta Sharma made a delightful pass to Simranjeet Singh who put it past German goalie Alexander Stadler.

It was an important equaliser that put India back in the hunt. But Germany earned back the lead in the 24th minute. Nilakanta this time had given away the ball cheaply in the midfield that led to German's attack. It was Christopher Ruhr who made a quick-fire pass to Niklas Wellen who launched the ball into the goal post.

Germany pumped another goal within the next minute when defender Surender Kumar lost the ball to German's double tackle inside the circle. Germany punished India for this error with Benedikt Furk scoring the third goal for Germany taking their lead to 3–1.

India bounced back soon enough with Simranjeet earning a PC in the 27th minute. It was experienced Rupinder Pal Singh taking the flick, and though keeper Stadler made a brilliant save, India's Hardik Singh was quick to take a rebound to successfully put it past the keeper.





Narrowing the German lead to 3–2, India played to their potential by winning another crucial PC in the 29th minute. This time, Harmanpreet Singh does exceedingly well to score his 6th goal of the tournament and fetching a very important 3–3 equaliser for India.

The 10-minute Half-time break was followed by a superb goal for India in the 31st minute through a PC. Germans lost the referral in the process and Rupinder Pal Singh converted a splendid penalty stroke putting India ahead with 4-3 score line.

India scored again in the 34th minute when Harmanpreet Singh was at the heart of a counterattack with his long scoop pass, Gurjant Singh showcased his brilliant stick work making a quick run into the right flank. He entered the circle to set up Simranjeet Singh who completed the attack with a fine deflection. This attack brought back memories from India's Junior World Cup campaign in 2016 that brough the talent of this trio – Gurjant Singh, Simranjeet and Harmanpreet Singh to the fore. The third quarter continued to be action packed with both teams trading PCs. But India did well to hold on to the 5–3 lead.



The final quarter remained tense with Germany scoring a goal off a PC in the 48th minute. This time it was Windfeder who scored for Germany. India gave away another opportunity for Germany to score when an early tackle by Sreejesh when Ruhr was going for a shot resulted in India conceding a PC. But Sreejesh made amends for the mistake with an excellent save to keep India in the driver's seat. The final few minutes was absolutely thrilling with Germany pushing for an equaliser. Germany won their 13th PC with less than 10 secs on the timer but India's defence held on, PR Sreejesh on target to bring home the Bronze Medal.

Post the heart-breaking loss, the Indian Women's Hockey Chief Coach Sjoerd Marijne told the team that they have won something more than a medal. "We showed a fighting spirit in the Bronze Medal match against Great Britain, but it wasn't enough. We gave away too many PCs and in these kinds of matches, you have to convert all your PCs into goals ,and I must say Gurjit (Kaur) did really well. I told the team that we didn't win a medal, but we achieved something bigger than a medal, and that's inspiring an entire nation."

When asked about the turning point for the Indian team in the Olympics during a virtual

conference, Marijne said, "After the Pool match against Great Britain, I was extremely angry with the team. I told the team that if you go down then show that you really tried and then go down. I told the team that they will have to do better and I think the team's

mindset transformed after that match. Janneke and I had a lot of individual meetings with the girls and they found the key for the next matches themselves. I think that was an important part of the tournament for us."



2–1. With a medal hope still alive, the Indian Women's Team played their hearts out in the Bronze Medal match against Great Britain, however, they couldn't achieve a podium finish after coming tantalizingly close.



The Chief Coach added that the Indian Women's Team players believing in themselves has made him proud, "We always had the belief that we can win a medal and we were really close. The girls believing in themselves makes me really proud. I think that was one of the biggest steps we made. Every girl in the team has her own story and every story is amazing. Let's hope that a lot of women in India have seen this Indian team's performance and are inspired by the team to start playing hockey or any other sport."

Marijne stressed the fact that staying in the moment was very important for the Indian team in the Olympics, "We finished among the top four in this competition and every team is now taking us seriously. I think that is a big step. We have always looked to stay in the

team is their desire to learn. They ask a lot of questions and are willing to try a lot of things, which is quite impressive. The girls want to learn and want to improve. As a Coach, you want your team to have success, but for me, it was great to see how the team fought and how they played as a team. It's been incredibly rewarding to be part of this team because of their mindset, wanting to learn, to get better, to fall, but to get back up. It's truly been amazing," said Schopman.

After recording their best ever performance in the Olympics in Tokyo this year, the Indian Women's Hockey

Team will now divert their attention to the upcoming Olympic cycle ahead of the Summer Games in Paris 2024, with the ambition of going one better and securing a coveted medal for Indian Women's Hockey.

This was the first big International Hockey tournament being held in India after the Covid-19 pandemic halted all sporting events in March 2020 and I am very proud that we have witnessed successful completion despite several challenges including cyclone Jawad."

The two finalists drew 3–3 in regulation time with Korea holding their nerves to take home the title with 4–2 win the shootout. The Indian team led by Captain Manpreet Singh finished third after beating nemesis Pakistan 4–3.

Indian Women's Hockey team began their 2022 season at the Women's Asia Cup in Muscat, Oman where they fielded a mixed team of young and experienced players to defend their title at the prestigious event. With the FIH Women's World Cup qualification at stake, the Indian Women's team had to see themselves finish one in four to ensure they book their ticket to FIH Hockey Women's World Cup in Spain and Netherlands in July. They stayed true to this target as the team did not disappoint by sticking to basics and executed well to register big wins against Malaysia 9-0, Singapore 9-1 in the round robin stage. However, the team lost to Japan 0-2. Making it to the final four, the Savita-led team lost to Korea 2-3 in a close Semi-final encounter but beat China 2-0 in the third/fourth placing match and thus earned their World Cup berth.

MEN'S & WOMEN'S

After a two-year Covid hiatus, the top-level International Hockey returned to its one true hub-Odisha with the FIH Hockey Pro League 2021/22 season. Both the Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Teams played their home matches at the iconic Kalinga Hockey Stadium in Bhubaneswar between February and April 2022.

After kickstarting their FIH Hockey Pro League campaign with three wins against teams like South Africa & France and a loss against France in Potchefstroom, the Indian Men's Hockey Team squared off against Spain in their first set of home matches on 26th and 27th February. The Indian team marched to a 5–4 win in the first game and lost 3–5 in their second.

The Tokyo Olympic Bronze medallists India picked up match points against every team they faced- Argentina (2–2 (1–3 SO) and 4–3), England (3–3 (3–2 SO) and 4–3) and Germany (3–0 and 3–1).

The Indian Women's Hockey Team, who are playing their maiden FIH Hockey Pro League, also finished the home leg on a strong note. The Indian eves have won four games and gained an extra point from a shootout. They lost two shootouts and lost only one match in regulation time. After starting their campaign with 7–1 and 2–1 wins against China in Muscat, the team led by Savita put up a solid show in their backyard. They won a game and lost one to Spain (2–1 and 3–4), lost 1–1 (1–2 SO) and won second game 1–1 (3–0) in the shootouts against Germany, and registered a 2–1 win and 1–1 (1–3) shootout loss against the World No. 1 Netherlands in their last set of home matches.

Hockey India was successful in organising international hockey matches in India despite the challenges with the ongoing pandemic. The Federation was successful in accommodating suitable dates to the teams who had to postpone their matches due to rise in Covid cases in their camp.





COUNTRY'S LARGEST HOCKEY STADIUM TO BE CONSTRUCTED IN ROURKELA

As Rourkela gears up to co-host the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar-Rourkela in January 2023, the brand-new Birsa Munda International Hockey Stadium will take centre stage for the prestigious quadrennial event. With Odisha set to host the World Cup for the second time running, the Birsa Munda International Hockey Stadium has been added as an additional venue after the previous event was staged solely in the capital city of Bhubaneswar.

With a seating capacity of 20,000, the stadium is set to become the largest Hockey stadium in the country — and the second largest in the world, second only to the National Stadium in Lahore. The Birsa Munda International Hockey Stadium will feature a modern outlook, equipped with the latest technology and state-of-the-art facilities.





Odisha Chief Minister Shri Naveen Patnaik laid the foundation stone for the stadium in February 2021, and the construction continues at a rapid pace to complete the project for test events to be held at the facility in the lead up to the main event – the FIH Men's Hockey World Cup 2023.

Situated in the heart of the Sundargarh district in Odisha — a region which has long served as a source of one world class talent after another for Indian Hockey — the International stadium will serve not only as a premium training facility for players in the region, but also as a source of inspiration to young hockey players who hold the dream of representing India on the big stage.



Celebrating its 75th year of Independence, this stadium will also serve as a reminder of India's growth in the world order, and how much the sport of hockey has grown in the country in recent years. Moreover, the airport in Rourkela is also being upgraded in line with International standards to give the city a complete makeover as it counts the days down to the 2023 World Cup.



After the successful organization of the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Courses since 2019, Hockey India conducted three important courses during the course of the year 2021–22. The Hockey India Level 'Basic' Coaching Course (Online) was conducted on 23 and 24 December 2021, meanwhile, Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' & Level '2' Coaching Course 2022 was organized between 5 to 12 March 2022 in New Delhi/Bhubaneswar and 27 to 30 March 2022 in Bhubaneswar respectively.

The Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway is a simplified education structure that consists of a combination of web-based modules and face-to-face interactive courses, underpinned by a competency-based assessment process, which helps the Coaches in progressing to higher levels.

A simplified education structure aims to help in developing coaches from the grassroots level into world-class coaches of the high performance/international level. Once a candidate progresses from the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway, they are then eligible to enroll for the FIH Academy Level 1 Course, and so on.

The Hockey India Coaches Education Pathway hasn't only catered to the major states of the country but has encouraged candidates to join the course from all parts of India – Nagaland, Tripura, Arunachal, Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Puducherry, Goa, Jharkhand and Odisha, among others.

The 2021–22 season was eventful for Hockey India. While both Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Teams created history at Tokyo Olympics 2020, the Federation successfully brought the domestic hockey calendar back on track. The season was filled with some enthralling action as well. Despite the pandemic challenges, Hockey India successfully staged international Hockey competitions like the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's Junior World Cup Bhubaneswar 2021 and the FIH Hockey Pro League 2021/22 in Bhubaneswar, Odisha.

The 2021–22 season started on a positive note, with the Indian Men's Hockey Team returning to the top-level international hockey competition – FIH Hockey Pro League after a year's wait. The Indian team had a six-match tour to Argentina in April 2021. Apart from the two-legged Pro League tie, the team also played four practice matches on the tour.

In August 2021, the Indian Hockey contingent created history at the prestigious Tokyo Olympics 2020. While the Men's team ended the 41-year Olympic medal drought by clinching the Bronze, the Women's team inspired the whole country with their historic fourth-place finish at the quadrennial Games.

Following their Olympic glory, the Indian Hockey contingent made a clean sweep at the FIH Hockey Stars Awards 2020–21 by winning in all eight categories. Both the Indian hockey teams were also felicitated by Central and State Governments and various stakeholders in the country.

Hockey India's Major Team Partner, Odisha State Government, extended its partnership with the National Teams for 10 more years. In November 2021, members of the Men's and Women's teams were also conferred with national awards for their heroics in Tokyo.



The 2021 domestic season resumed in October, with the 1st Hockey India Sub Junior Men Academy National Championship 2021 followed by 1st Hockey India Junior Men Academy National Championships 2021 held in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh. The 11th Hockey India Junior Women National Championship 2021, Simdega, Jharkhand and the 11th Hockey India Senior Women National Championship 2021, Jhansi, Uttar Pradesh, the 1st Hockey India Senior Women Inter-Department National Championship 2021 held in Kolkata, West Bengal were successfully organised in the same month.

In December 2021, Hockey India successfully organised as many as three national championships—11th Hockey India Senior Men National Championship Pimpri Chinchwad 2021, 11th Hockey India Junior Men National Championship 2021, Kovilpatti, Tamil Nadu and the 1st Hockey India Senior Men Inter-Department National Championship 2021 held in Bengaluru, Karnataka.

Apart from developing the players, Hockey India also emphasised on developing the Coaches from the grassroots. Hence, continuing the unique Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway, the apex body conducted Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level 'Basic' Coaching Courses (Online) and Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' & '2' in 2021. The federation also conducted Hockey India umpires & Technical Officials Online

Workshops 2022, Hockey India Technical Officials 'Level 1' Online Workshops 2022 and Hockey India Umpires 'Level 1' Online in this eventful season.

Making the best use of technology, Hockey India launched two unique online portals—Heroes Connect and Photo Library. Heroes Connect is a unique web–responsive platform, which has been launched to curate a detailed database of Indian Men's and Women's Hockey Team members, while Photo Library is introduced to innovate and further enhance the popularity of the Indian Hockey Teams globally.

After having successfully staged all the National Championships in the pandemic-hit 2021 calendar, Hockey India kickstarted the 2022 domestic season in March, with the 2nd Hockey India Senior Women Inter-Department National Championship 2022 and the 2nd Hockey India Sub Junior Men Academy National Championship 2022 held in New Delhi and Ghumanhera respectively.

The biggest highlights of this challenging yet exciting 2021–22 season were the successful completion of the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's Junior World Cup Bhubaneswar 2021 and the FIH Hockey Pro League 2021/22 home matches. These were the two major international events hosted in India for the first time after the dreaded virus disrupted all the sporting events in 2020.

Hockey India congratulates Dr. Narinder Dhruv Batra on being elected as President of FIH for a second consecutive term

Hockey India congratulated Dr Narinder Dhruv Batra who created yet another historic milestone for Indian sport. He became the first Indian to be re-elected as President of the International Hockey Federation (FIH) for the second consecutive term at the 47th FIH Congress on Saturday, 22nd May 2021. Dr Batra secured 63 votes out of 124 to edge past tough opponent in Belgium's Marc Coudron, the only other candidate for the FIH Presidency at the Congress. In 2016, Dr Batra who was then an Executive Board Member of FIH as well as the Vice-President of the Asian Hockey Federation, became the first Indian to head a global sports governing body when he replaced outgoing FIH President Leandro Negre, for a four-year term. With him being re-elected for the top post, Dr Batra will continue to serve as President of FIH till 2024.


Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) continue to organize Online Education Workshops exclusively for Hockey India Coaches and Umpires





The Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) conducted a series of Online Education Workshops between throughout the 2021-22

season for Umpires, Coaches, and Technical Officials. Aimed at providing technical expertise and knowledge on various aspects of communication and mental toughness, the online education workshops were conducted free of cost, consisting of a three to four hours' sessions each. In September 2021, AHF conducted a set of Online Education Workshops, exclusively for the Hockey India Coaches, Umpires and Technical Officials. A group of 12–30 Umpires attended the two AHF – HI Exclusive Online Education Workshops in the month. Along with the online workshops exclusively for Hockey India, the Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) also organized set of online education workshops for all Asian hockey–playing nations in September. Hockey India nominated a maximum of six candidates for each of these education workshops. The Asian Hockey Federation continued the Development Through Distance "AHF Online Education Workshops" program November 2021, January 2022 and to March 2022, for Umpires, Coaches, and Technical Officials. All Asian hockey–playing nations were allowed to nominate a maximum of 2 candidates for each education workship of whom one candidate was required to be a woman. At the end of the AHF online education workshops, participating candidates were provided a certificate to help them in the future FIH & AHF Course Selection.



Hockey India launched the Flashback Series in the lead up to the Tokyo Olympics 2020

In the build-up to the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, Hockey India launched the Flashback Series to relive the memories from the triumphant Olympic campaigns in the past through annecdotes from Indian hockey legends.

Former Indian Hockey Forward Gurdev Singh kicked off Hockey India's Flashback Series with memories from the 1956 Olympics, where India clinched Gold medal. Gurdev went on to reminisce about playing alongside the great Balbir Singh Sr in the first article of the series.

In the second article, Charanjit Singh recalled his two Olympic medal winning feats and the golden era of Indian Hockey at the quadrennial Games. His first honours with the senior team came in the 1960 Rome Olympics, where the team finished with the Silver medal and four

years later, he was the proud Captain of the Indian team that won back the historic Olympic title from Pakistan at the 1964 Tokyo Olympics.

In the third instalment, legend and former India Captain Gurbux Singh remembered India's great Olympic run in 1964 in Tokyo, where India defeated bitter rival Pakistan 1–0 in the Final. He was also part of the 1968 Olympics Bronze medal-winning team.

In the fourth article of Hockey India's Flashback Series, Indian hockey stalwart and former Captain Ajit Pal Singh got nostalgic as he recalled his dream Olympic debut and India's back-to-back Bronze medal-winning feat at the 1968 Mexico and 1972 Munich Olympic Games.











Former India Hockey Captain BP Govinda went on a trip down memory lane in the fifth article of Flashback Series, talking fondly of his glory days as an iconic figure with a distinctive headband. He was an integral part of Indian team that won Bronze medal at the 1972 Munich Olympic Games.

In the sixth article of Hockey India's Flashback Series, iconic India 'Left Forward' and former Captain Zafar Iqbal fondly remembers the victorious memories of the Indian Men's Hockey Team's Olympic Gold medal winning campaign in the 1980 Moscow Olympics.

Former Indian Men's Hockey Team Captain MM Somaya was a mainstay in the triumphant Indian side of the 1980s. In the seventh article, the three-time Olympian spoke about his excitement of making his India debut at the 1980 Olympics, where India clinched its historic 8th Gold medal.

In the eighth article of Hockey India's Flashback Series, former Indian striker Jagbir Singh went back in time to reflect on India's topsy-turvy campaign at the 1988 Seoul Olympics and the remarkable fightback to the top six after finishing at the bottom of the table in the 1986 World Cup.









Former Indian goalkeeper AB Subbaiah revisited his memories from the 1992 Barcelona and 1996 Atlanta Olympics in the ninth article of Flashback Series to emphasise that the Olympics continue to be the pinnacle of competitive hockey.

In the 10th article of the series, former India Captain Dilip Tirkey; who holds the Indian record for most International appearances, with 412 Caps over a 15 year-long International career, recalled interesting stories from the 1996 and 2000 Olympic Games.

In the eleventh article of Hockey India's Flashback Series, hockey legend Dhanraj Pillay recalled interesting anecdotes from his first Olympic Games in 1992 and narrowly missing out on a Semi Final berth in the Sydney Olympics in 2000.




Hockey India celebrates Olympic Day 2021 by bringing the hockey community together through exciting activities

Indian Hockey Teams achieve best-ever FIH World Rankings after good show at Tokyo Olympics 2020; Men's Team rise to 3rd and Women's Team to 8th

Riding on their historic Tokyo Olympics 2020 campaign, both Indian Men's and Women's Hockey teams achieved their highest ever FIH World rankings.

The Indian Men's Hockey team, which ended a 41-year medal drought by clinching the Bronze Medal in Tokyo, rose to 3rd in the International Hockey Federation (FIH) World Rankings, behind Belgium and Australia, respectively. Whereas, the Indian Women's Hockey Team, acquired 8th position according to the latest FIH world rankings.

Manpreet and Co. finished second in Pool A winning four out of five group phase matches and defeated Great Britain 3–1 in Quarter Final before losing 5–2 against Belgium in their

historic Semi Final. However, they staged a remarkable comeback to bag a 5-4 win over Germany to clinch a historic Bronze medal at Olympic Games and as a result they climbed up to their best-ever world ranking.

Having achieved their highest-ever world rankings, the Indian Men's Hockey Team Captain Manpreet expressed, "It's the reward of all the hard work and dedication towards the game we love, towards the game which has given us everything. This ranking and the Olympic medal after 41 years mark the rise of Indian Hockey, and I think this couldn't have

happened without the support of the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Sports Authority of India, Odisha Government and Hockey India. There is no looking back now, we have set the benchmark for ourselves and would like to grow from here."

Men's team Chief Coach Graham Reid stated, "I must admit, I feel privileged to have played a part in the rise of Indian Hockey. It's a great feeling that we won the historic Bronze Medal as well as achieving the highest ranking on the back of our solid performance in the Olympics. We played like a unit, with the right kind of attitude, and I think that has helped the team achieve this feat. Also, Hockey India, Sports Authority of India and all the stakeholders involved with the

Indian Hockey has played a huge part in bringing back the team where it truly belongs."



On the other hand, the Indian eves, who suffered three losses in the initial matches, went on pulled off arguably the biggest upset by beating World No. 3 Australia in what was their first ever auarterfinal of the Olympic Games. Rani & Co. missed out on the Olympic Medal by a whisker, having lost to Great Britain in the Bronze Medal Play-Off match. Hence, finishing fourth at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics led India Women's Hockey Team to move up to 8th in the world rankings.

Indian Women's Hockey Team Skipper Rani said, "We were very close to finishing on the Podium, and it is hurting the

team that we didn't. However, looking at the bright side, we have made remarkable progress in recent years, and I am really proud of it. Finishing in the top four at Olympics, and climbing to the 8th position in world rankings, is a very big thing for us, and this has boosted our confidence, it will certainly help us grow going forward. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the Odisha Government, Hockey India and Sports Authority of India for the continuous support and encouragement."

Indian Women's team Chief Coach Sjoerd Marijne expressed, "It's the result of all the hard work that girls have put in over the past few years. Achieving 8th rank in the world ranking and finishing among the top four at Olympics, is a big step for Indian Women's hockey, and I think every team will definitely take us seriously. The athletes have that desire to learn and improve each and every day, and I



feel this is one of the biggest reasons why we could finish among the top four."

Before this feat, the Manpreet Singh-led side's career-high ranking was No.4, which they achieved in March 2020 on the back of their scintillating performances in the first three rounds of the second edition of FIH Hockey Pro League 2020.

Whereas, the Indian Women's team's earlier highest world ranking was 9th, which they accomplished by producing their best finish (Quarter Finals) at the Vitality Hockey Women's World Cup London 2018 in four decades. Having reached the quarterfinals of the World Cup, the women's team had become the top-ranked Asian team and went on to clinch the silver medal at the 2018 Asian Games in Jakarta.

Indian Hockey Olympic heroes get grand welcome in Delhi

After scripting history at the recently concluded Tokyo Olympics 2020, the Indian Men's and Women's Hockey teams were given a grand welcome by Hockey India at the Ashoka Hotel in New Delhi on Monday, 09 August 2021.

Members of both the teams were garlanded and presented with mementos by the delegates of Hockey India on their arrival at the entrance of the hotel amid beat of dhols and loud cheering.

Both the Bronze Medal-winning men's team and the fourth-place finishing women's team cut cakes after arriving at the hotel and sang the National Anthem during the felicitation program organized by Hockey India.

Earlier in the day, Indian Hockey teams, along with other athletes of the Indian Olympic contingent, were accorded a rousing welcome by a huge crowd upon their arriving at Indira Gandhi International Airport.

With an intent to innovate and further enhance the popularity of the Indian Hockey Teams globally, the Hockey India Photo Library was made live on Tuesday, 31 August 2021. With this new initiative, Hockey India becomes one of the first National Sports Federations to launch a portal dedicated to images of the sport which will include a massive repository of digital images of the Indian Teams and players. Images from ongoing tournaments too will be uploaded on to the Photo Library in real time.

With a friendly user interface, the Hockey India Photo Library is a searchable image library which allows users to locate images using various search options such as player name, date, year, matches, tournaments, orientation and popularity.

To download images, an auto-generated form will suffice and the users will need to complete the process of requesting permissions, by sharing basic details such as name, email, contact details and purpose, which will be reviewed by Hockey India and subsequently approved. The portal allows users an option of downloading images in four sizes-small, medium, large and original as per their requirements.

Additionally, there are particular categories for Hockey India, Hockey India Member Units, Media and Designers, who have direct access to a particular set of images and are not required to go through the process of requesting permissions. These categories have been created in the software itself, with access login credentials sent to their registered email IDs. All that the users need to do is give credits to Hockey India for usage of the images.

PR Sreejesh becomes first male Indian athlete to win the World Games Athlete of the Year

In January this year, experienced Indian hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh, who was part of the men's team that claimed the Bronze medal in the Tokyo Olympics, became only the second India athlete to win the prestigious World Games Athlete of the Year for his 2021 performances.

In 2020, Rani became the first Indian athlete to be voted as the World Games Athlete of the year following her incredible performances in 2019 where she had helped her team clinch Olympic Qualification after defeating USA. She had also played a crucial role in the team's success at the FIH Series Final that Year.

In a global fan vote conducted on TheWorldGames.org, Sreejesh finished well clear at the top of the 24-strong nomination list, with his tally of 1,27,647 votes being almost twice as many as the second-placed athlete, Spain's Sport Climbing ace Albert Ginés Lopez, who garnered 67,428 votes.



Hockey India starts National Coaching Camp after a successful campaign at the Tokyo Olympic Games 2020

With the resumption of international competitions, Hockey India conducted numerous National Camps in SAI, Bengaluru as well as Kalinga Hockey Stadium in Bhubaneswar, Odisha for Senior Men, Senior Women, Junior Men and Junior Women throughout the 2021–22 season.

Both the teams spent most of their time at Camp in Bengaluru since the onset of COVID-19 virus. After their first international assignments in early 2021, the Indian Men and Women's Hockey teams shifted their focus on the Tokyo Olympics. In April and May they had Olympics selection camp and from June till their departure for Tokyo, they had Preparatory Camp at SAI Centre, Bengaluru.

After their successful campaign at the Tokyo Olympic Games, both teams (Women's Team – September 2021; Men's Team – October 2021) returned to SAI, Bengaluru to begin the new Olympic cycle.

The Junior Men's team along with the Senior team trained in Bhubaneswar, while both Women's teams have had their coaching camp in SAI, Bengaluru in November 2021. The Junior team had their preparatory camp for the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's Junior World Cup Bhubaneswar 2021.

With an aim to build on their historic Tokyo 2020 Olympics campaign, Hockey India in December 2021 named 60 players for both

the Senior Women's and Men's National Camp which took place in SAI, Bengaluru. After selection trials, Hockey India in January 2022 announced core probable groups of both the teams for major tournaments that are scheduled this year.

After a three-week National Coaching Camp (in February 2022) at SAI, Bengaluru, Hockey India also announced core probable lists of both the junior men's and women's teams for the 2022 season.

Following their respective FIH Hockey Pro League away matches, both Senior Men's and Women's teams regrouped in Bhubaneswar for training and preparation camp for the home leg of Pro League, which took place between February and April. The Junior Women's Core Group too had their selection and preparatory Camp for Junior World Cup 2021 in Bhubaneswar.

Meanwhile, in the month of March, Hockey India also formed India 'A' Men's and Women's core probables group. The newly formed teams had their Coaching Camp at the SAI Centre in Bengaluru in the same month.

The core probable groups of all six teams — Senior Men, Senior Women, Junior Men, Junior Women, India 'A' Men and India 'A' Women— are currently at the National Coaching Camp at SAI Centre in Bengaluru.


