13TH HOCKEY INDIA JUNIOR MEN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP 2023

The 13th Hockey India Junior Men's National Championship 2023 was one of the most entertaining tournaments in the domestic circuit in Indian hockey this year, with teams scoring plenty of goals. The highest-scoring game saw Delhi Hockey smash 54 goals past Tripura Hockey without response.

The 13th Hockey India Junior Men's National Championship 2023 was played out at the Birsa Munda Hockey Stadium in Rourkela, Odisha. HOCKEY SIMDEGA TOURNAMENTS IN JHARKHAND ATTRACT OVER 1900 PLAYERS FROM 87 PANCHAYATS

Hockey India has introduced the 'Hockey India ka Abhiyan Har Ghar Ho Hockey Ki Pehchan' program, which focuses on promoting hockey in all districts by organizing coaching camps and intra-district competitions. In Jharkhand, Simdega district has set a remarkable example by hosting tournaments that provide young players from various areas with opportunities to compete at a higher level.

Shri Manoj Kumar Prasad, President of Hockey Simdega and Vice President of Hockey Jharkhand, explained the tournament format in the district and said, "In Simdega, there are 94 Panchayats. We are combining 3-4 Panchayats and hosting trial tournaments between teams from these Panchayats. We have already held 22 tournaments across 87 Panchayats, with around 1900 players competing. We will organise two more tournaments comprising teams from the remaining 7 Panchayats."

The selected players for these tournaments are under 16 years old and have limited hockey experience. The aim is to provide them with proper coaching so that they can be prepared for sub-junior tournaments in the coming year.

Manoj further revealed the plan to hold a tournament among the winning teams from all 24 tournaments. The top four teams from that tournament, along with eight experienced hockey teams from Simdega, will compete in another tournament at the district level.

Overall, the program has been successful in engaging young players in Simdega and promoting the growth of hockey in the district.



ASSAM HOCKEY EMPHASIZES ON COACHING; PROMOTES HOCKEY IN 29 DISTRICTS THIS SUMMER

Assam Hockey has been working towards Hockey India's visionary initiative - 'Hockey India ka Abhiyan Har Ghar Ho Hockey Ki Pehchan' - by organising numerous district-level tournaments to develop the hockey culture in the state and also provide ample opportunities for young children for showcasing their talent and swiftly come up the ranks.

Shri Tapan Kumar Das, General Secretary of Assam Hockey, provided a detailed account of how the state hockey association is leaving no stone unturned to develop and professionalise hockey at every level in Assam.

"Assam Hockey has a tie-up with the State Level Advisory Committee for Students and Youth Welfare, Assam (SLAC) for the development of hockey at every level in Assam," Tapan said.


Tapan further revealed that SLAC in association with Assam Hockey will provide hockey coaches to

"We are committed to improving our training program and for the same reason we are in the process of providing hockey coaches to every district. Most of the shortlisted coaches are Senior Level players and they belong from different states like Haryana, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh etc," Tapan said.

He went on to laud Hockey India for coming up with a plethora of initiatives at the district level to encourage youngsters to not only take up the game but also make a career out of it.

"Hockey India is doing an excellent job, especially in promoting the game to remote parts of the country. Young players are elated as there are now a bunch of opportunities for them to exhibit their skills and talent," Tapan signed off.



HOCKEY GIVES YOUNGSTERS OF JAMMU AND KASHMIR A NEW DIRECTION

Hockey has been becoming a popular sport in Jammu and Kashmir, especially among youngsters, courtesy of initiatives by Hockey Jammu & Kashmir and Jammu & Kashmir Sports Council.

Supinder Deep Singh Bakshi, General Secretary of Hockey Jammu and Kashmir, provided a detailed description of how hockey is not only flourishing in the UT but also providing positive direction and ample opportunities to young players.

"First of all, we are focusing on the development of hockey infrastructure in Jammu and Kashmir. Nowadays, hockey is played on Astroturf instead of natural turf (grass) and given the fact that there was only one Astroturf in Jammu and Kashmir, hockey in the UT suffered a great deal. However, last year the J&K Sports Council decided to set up more Astroturfs in different districts of Jammu and Kashmir," Bakshi said.

Hockey J&K has successfully conducted numerous tournaments across age categories in different districts despite facing challenges like extreme weather conditions and high-security situations in the UT.

In March this year, Senior Hockey Tournament (Men) was organised at Astroturf Hockey Stadium in District Jammu by Hockey J&K and sponsored by J&K Sports Council, while in A pril, Junior Hockey Tournament (Men) was organized in Jammu and it saw the participation of eight teams.

All these local tournaments align with Hockey India's

visionary program - 'Hockey India ka Abhiyan Har Ghar Ho Hockey Ki Pehchan' which was unveiled recently to promote the sport in regions where hockey is not so popular. The initiative also focuses on scouting and nurturing young talents.

Bakshi also highlighted how hockey is helping those youngsters who come from troubled regions of Jammu and Kashmir and are vulnerable to violence.

"Hockey is playing an instrumental role in putting the youngsters of J&K on the right track. Anyone who plays hockey has his/her mind fully dedicated towards the sport and does not get distracted by irrelevant things. To date, we haven't heard of any hockey player from the UT involved in any kind of unlawful activity," Bakshi said.



KERALA HOCKEY WORKING STRENUOUSLY ON DEVELOPING NATIONAL-LEVEL TALENTS

Kerala Hockey has been working hard to engage more youngsters in the sport. There was a time when hockey was primarily popular in Kerala's Kannur and Thiruvananthapuram. However, due to the efforts of the state federation, most districts in the state are now demonstrating their interest in the sport.

"To promote hockey at the base level, we started a coaching camp in 2019 across all the districts. From 2020 onwards, we also started distributing hockey sticks and balls to schools," Rony Raynold, Executive Officer, Kerala Hockey and Kerala Olympic Association said.

"To develop hockey at the base level, Kerala Hockey distributed around 7000 hockey sticks and balls to around 298 schools in the state. Further, the senior players from the state are going as coaches to train these students in schools," he further added.

As a result of these initiatives, students from most districts have begun competing in hockey tournaments. Raynold pointed out that these steps have increased the reach of the sport at the base level. Raynold described how the state federation had established a clear path for hockey talent to get the needed exposure.

While the hockey culture is expanding in Kerala, Raynold admitted that it might take some time for the state to produce talents that can compete at the international level, but added that they are on the correct path.

Hockey India recently announced the 'Hockey India ka Abhiyan Har Ghar Ho Hockey Ki Pehchan' program, which aims to engage all districts in hosting regular coaching camps and intra-district competitions to spread hockey to remote parts of India. Raynold said that Kerala Hockey shares the same vision and is working towards achieving similar goals.

"Our mission is to spread hockey in every household in Kerala. We align with Hockey India's mindset to spread hockey everywhere as it is a beautiful sport," he signed off.

Newly-appointed Indian Men's Hockey Team Chief Coach Craig Fulton arrived in India on the morning of 28 April 2023. The 48-year-old South African landed in New Delhi where he met with Hockey India officials. On the same day, he flew down to Bengaluru where he took over the reins of the National Coaching Camp is held at the Sports Authority of India (SAI).

Fulton, who was named the Chief Coach of the Indian Men's Hockey Team by Hockey India in March 2023, comes with nearly 25 years of coaching experience and has achieved many milestones during his association with the Irish Men's team and reigning Olympic Champions Belgium. His rise to fame started with a stint with the Irish Men's Team as the Head Coach between 2014 and 2018 when the team qualified for the Rio Olympic Games 2016. This was the Irish team's first Olympic qualification in 100 years. This historic feat also won him the FIH Coach of the Year in 2015.

Following this, he worked as the Assistant Coach with the reigning Olympic Champions Belgium, where the Belgium team won the Gold medal in Tokyo. He was also part of the Belgian Coaching Staff when the team lifted the World title in 2018, in Bhubaneswar. He was also named Belgium Coach of the Year 2023 after coaching the Belgium club which won the Belgium League.

The Indian Junior Men's hockey team inked a historic 2-1 win over arch-rivals Pakistan in the Final of the Men's Junior Asia Cup 2023 in Salalah, Oman. This was India's fourth title at Men's Junior Asia Cup, having won it previously in 2004, 2008 and 2015. Pakistan are the second-most successful team in the tournament with three titles but their last win came 27 years ago in 1996.

Playing in front of a near-capacity crowd at the Salalah Sports Complex, both teams looked threatening from the start but Angad Bir Singh's strike in the 13th minute helped India get on the scoresheet. Araijeet Singh Hundal, India's top-scorer at Men's Junior Asia Cup 2023 with eight goals, doubled the lead five minutes into the second quarter.

Though Pakistan were relentless in their pursuit of pulling one back, India had more meaningful possession. A brilliant save from Indian goalkeeper HS Mohith protected India's lead going into the second half.

Despite earning multiple penalty corners and keeping most of the possession, Pakistan could not break the defensive wall led by goalkeeper HS Mohith and India managed to hold onto their lead and win the trophy. HS Mohith was named the Best Goalkeeper of the Tournament. "After the 1-1 draw in the round-robin stage, we were very aware of the areas we had to do well in order to beat Pakistan," said India captain Uttam Singh, who was awarded the Player of the Match. "It was quite a nervous final. The team had never played in front of such a big crowd but I think the early goals helped us stay in control of the game."

Only a fortnight later, the Indian Junior Women's Team emulated the success of their male counterparts. The result was instantly celebrated across the country as this was their maiden title at this prestigious tournament.

They won 2-1 against the formidable South Korea, four-time winners of the title, in a hard-fought final. Goals were scored by Annu (21') and Neelam (40') while Seoyeon Park scored the lone goal for Korea.

India eves put on an attacking front to put their opponents on the back seat right at the start. Though an early lead by Annu through her penalty stroke was levelled soon after by Park's field goal, India bounced back as they switched to swift counterattacks in the third quarter. The tactic paid off as Neelam converted a penalty corner to put India in front as the third quarter ended with the score 2-1 in favour of the Indian team. In order to protect their lead, India shifted their focus on defending and controlled the tempo of the game by keeping possession in the fourth quarter. On the other hand, Korea made forced errors and misdirected passes in their desperation to find an equaliser. Ultimately, India stood strong and stuck to their strategy to win the title clash 2-1.

"It was a brave effort by the team, and we did well to defend the scoreline till the end. It was a tense match but we were mentally prepared for this Final clash and we are happy to have created history."

With these two incredible feats, not only did the Indian Junior Men and Women earn a much-deserved entry to the FIH Junior World Cup later this year but they were also showered with appreciation and best wishes by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi in his radio show Mann Ki Baat.

Hockey India too recognised the significant feat and announced cash award of INR 2 lakh each for players and INR 1 lakh for the support staff.

"We are aware that each Pool is filled with talented and formidable opponents, but we see this as an opportunity to showcase our skills, determination, and teamwork on the global stage. We are confident in our abilities and will give our all in every match," she added. Cup Malaysia 2023 was officially launched on 24 June 2023 at the Mercure Living Hotel in Putrajaya, Malaysia.

India Colts have been placed in Pool C alongside Canada, Korea and Spain. According to the schedule, India's campaign will commence against Korea on 5th December in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, while they will take on Spain in their second Pool game on 7th December. In their third and last Pool game, India will clash with Canada on 9th December.

Speaking on the Pools draw, India's Men's Junior Asia Cup 2023 winning Captain Uttam Singh said, "The Pool's draw for the World Cup has set the stage for some intense competition. We are thrilled to be part of such a prestigious tournament and look forward to testing our mettle against the world's best junior teams. Our goal is to make our country proud and leave a lasting impression."

Each team in the Pool stage will play the other three teams in their respective Pool once and the top two teams from each Pool will progress to the Quarter-Finals, while the remaining teams will play for classification positions.

Revealing her success mantra, Sunelita said that it was her coach's simple but important advice that changed her life for good. "My coach told me that my game is good but it's the hard work that makes a person successful. So, that's the advice I'm following till now and that's why I always aim to work hard and give my hundred percent in anything I do," she said.

Indian Men's Hockey Team attacking midfielder Simranjeet Singh in August 2021 proved his mettle at the grandest stage when he scored a brace to help his team post a 5-4 victory over Germany in the Tokyo Olympics Bronze medal match, paving the way for India's return to the podium in the Olympic Games in men's hockey after 41 years.

But his career hit a major roadblock since then having suffered numerous injuries and missing some key tournaments including Hero Asia Cup in Jakarta and FIH Odisha Hockey Men's World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar-Rourkela which was held from 13th to 29th January 2023. Though he was part of the Asia Cup team, he returned home midway after playing the first match against Pakistan due to injury.

However, the 26-year-old mercurial talent has made a comeback to the Core group and also took part in the Indian team's remaining FIH Hockey Pro League 2022/23 matches in Europe.

"I am super happy to return to the National Coaching Camp after struggling with injuries for quite some time," Simranjeet said, before adding, "It was disheartening for me to miss the World Cup."

Simranjeet also revealed that he took inspiration from Brazilian ace Neymar Jr to sail through the difficult period and make a comeback.

"In sports, players can suffer injuries at any given moment but it depends on them how they deal with it and make a comeback. For me, Neymar served as an inspiration as despite getting injured numerous times, the Brazilian footballer has always made a strong comeback. Likewise, I also focused on regaining full fitness, did all the necessary things to make a comeback and most importantly, I never gave up."

Talking about his goals, Simranjeet, who played a key role in India's Junior World Cup win in 2016, said, "I am focused on making it to the squad for the Hangzhou Asian Games, which will be played later this year. The tournament is crucial for us as it will give us an opportunity to directly qualify for the 2024 Paris Olympics and also assert our dominance in Asia."

Talking about her rough phase and how she tackled it, Mumtaz said, "It was a big setback for me as I suffered an injury for the first time in my career and it turned out to be an ACL tear. I was very anxious while recovering from the injury and used to think if I'll be able to walk again or not. If it's the end of my career?"

"I was very irritated and used to cry a lot during that rough period, but I still managed to complete my rehab in 6-7 months. I motivated myself to get back on the field as soon as possible and play as I used to before I got injured," she added

Mumtaz also expressed her gratitude to her team members, coaches and support staff for helping her get back on her feet when she was struggling.

"I was a junior team player when I got injured. So, I didn't have any job back then nor was I financially stable. However, Hockey India supported me in every possible way during that time and even put me in rehab with the senior team. There used to be a physio, a trainer and members of medical staff to take care of me and assured me that I will be fit again to play. Moreover, senior players used to check in on me and provide moral support during rehab. Hence, I am really grateful to Hockey India for extending a helping hand when I needed it the most," she said..

Mumtaz further revealed that she didn't tell her parents about her injuries in order to keep them stress-free. "I never told my parents about my injuries even when I went under the knife. I didn't involve my parents as there were already many other issues they were dealing with and I didn't want to add to their tension."

Mumtaz was India's top goal scorer and third-highest overall at the 2022 Women's FIH Hockey Junior World Cup in South Africa with eight goals. Owing to her impressive performance in the tournament, Mumtaz was also named in the senior squad for Hero FIH Hockey 5s Lausanne 2022 in which she scored five goals. Notably, Mumtaz Khan was named FIH Women's Rising Star of the Year in 2021 and she also won Hockey India Asunta Lakra Award for Upcoming Player of the Year 2022. Speaking on the same, she said, "Given the fact that I was on the verge of giving up on hockey after getting injured, it was no less than a dream for me to win the two prestigious awards. Also, I received the FIH Women's Rising Star of Year award due to my team as all the players in the junior team were very supportive and it was a bonding between us which helped me put up a good show on the field."

Mumtaz played an instrumental role in the Indian Junior Women's Hockey Team's titlewinning campaign at the recently held Junior Asia Cup in Japan.

As part of Hockey India's initiative to bring hockey to every city, colony, block and village, Hockey India office bearers are ensuring that these tournaments and coaching camps take place regularly," expressed Shri Bhola Nath Singh, Secretary General of Hockey India.

The Indian Women's Hockey Team toured Australia for five games from 18 to 23 May at the MATE Stadium in Adelaide. In the first game, which was Monika's 200th senior cap, the Indian Women's Hockey Team went down 2-4 against the hosts with Sangita Kumari and Sharmila Devi finding the back of the net for the visitors. The second contest saw Deep Grace Ekka complete 250 caps in the Indian colours. However, once again, hosts Australia had the better day on the field, winning 3-2 against the Indian Women's Hockey Team, with Sangita Kumari and Gurjit Kaur scoring.

The third match of the tour was a landmark game as well for a couple of players as Captain Savita got

her 250th cap and Nikki Pradhan registered appearance number 150. The Indian Women's Hockey Team put in a solid performance, thwarting the Australians and coming away with a 1-1 draw, with Deep Grace Ekka getting on the scoresheet.

The Indian Women's Hockey Team faced Australia A in the final two games of the tour. The first contest saw the hosts overpower India narrowly, as they won 3-2. It was Sangita Kumari, who was among the scorers again, along with Salima Tete. The Indian Women's Hockey Team however were able to round off the testing tour on a positive note by winning the last match of the tour 2-1. Navneet Kaur and Deep Grace Ekka scored for India. It was India's only win on the tour.

HOCKEY INDIA LAUNCHES MATCH OFFICIALS EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT PLAN TO EMPOWER ASPIRING UMPIRES AND TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

In their bid to empower aspiring Umpires and Technical Officials in the country, Hockey India on 28 June 2023 launched a holistic Hockey India Match Officials Education and Development Plan.

Through this initiative, Hockey India aims to develop and educate the Umpires and Technical Officials currently officiating at the district and state level tournaments. The educational plan will provide these officials with an opportunity to progress and be inducted into the Hockey India officiating system will enable them to officiate in Hockey India sanctioned Sub Junior and Junior Level Zonal National Championships initially and also equip them to be included in the Hockey India potential list.

Hockey India notified its Member Units to nominate their registered Umpires and Technical Officials through the Hockey India Member Unit Portal. As part of the development process, the nominated candidates will be further selected by Hockey India as per their eligibility and will be attending the Hockey India Umpires & Technical Officials workshops scheduled in the month of July 2023. The course will be held in five zones namely in New Delhi, Pune, Andhra Pradesh, Jamshedpur and North East. The venue for the North East zone will be revealed later.

To ensure equal representation by women, the Federation has asked its members to nominate a maximum of 6 Technical Officials and Umpires each out of which 3 must be female and 3 male. Altogether a maximum of 12 nominations are requested from the Member Units.

The candidates who enrol for the Match Officials Education and Development Plan will receive interactive learning and study material to keep them updated with the latest FIH rules and regulations. To implement what they have learnt in theory, they will get a chance to officiate as an Umpire/ Technical Official at the Hockey India sanctioned All India Sub Junior & Junior category Tournaments & National Championships. They will also be eligible to attend future FIH Academy, AHF & Hockey India Umpires & Technical Officials Courses and workshops.

Urging the Member Units to encourage youngsters to take up the course, Hockey India President Padma Shri Dr. Dilip Tirkey said, "Over the last few years, Hockey India has persistently hosted online workshops for officials to up-skill their knowledge. This has in turn helped many of our officials get an opportunity to officiate in international matches. With an aim to get more people enrolled into the Hockey India officiating system, we have launched a first-ofits-kind holistic Match Officials Education and Development Plan that will bring aspiring officials up to speed with international standards."

Hailing the initiative, Hockey India Secretary General Shri Bhola Nath Singh stated, "This educational plan is important for the development of officiating standards within the country because it is not enough to nurture and develop young talent; it is imperative that we ensure that when these young players go to play at District, Zonal, or State level tournaments, they have the best of the best experience not just in terms of the matches being conducted but also in terms officiating standards in the tournament."

"These candidates will also have the opportunity to officiate at the Sub Junior and Junior category Hockey India sanctioned tournaments and put their knowledge to test, raising the bar for the quality of hockey being played across the country," he concluded.



On Olympic day, Hockey India and its Member Units organized various events with the objective of strengthening the connection between individuals of all ages and sports. These activities were aimed at bringing people from diverse backgrounds together, transcending gender and physical barriers, and providing them with the opportunity to engage in their first sports experiences.

'MY FAMILY HAS ALWAYS BEEN MY BIGGEST SUPPORT SYSTEM,' SAYS INDIAN JUNIOR WOMEN'S HOCKEY TEAM PLAYER NEELAM

Hailing from Kaimri – a small village located in Hisar district in Haryana, Neelam's path to becoming a hockey player began in her childhood when she observed her elder sister and cousin sister heading to the ground to play hockey.

However, the path to success was not easy for the 19-year-old defender, who was part of the Indian team that recently made the nation proud by winning the Women's Junior Asia Cup 2023 in Japan.

From financial constraints to injury issues, Neelam had to face numerous challenges in her journey so far, but she overcame every hurdle due to the support and collective determination of her family, which includes her father, mother, two sisters, and brother.

"My father is a farmer, while my mother is a homemaker. There was a phase in our life when we were going through a financial crisis as my father's income was completely dependent on growing and selling crops and

sometimes the whole process would take six months. So, there were times when there was no money left in the house. I even remember asking my mother for Rs 500 once as I had to travel to participate in a hockey tournament which was a 10-day affair. But, due to insufficient funds, my mother had to borrow the sum from our neighbours," Neelam said.

"However, even in the toughest of times, every member of my family always respected me and my decisions and never stopped me from playing hockey. Also, once my eldest sister got a job, she made sure that I stop thinking about financial constraints and focus only on playing hockey. My sister even gifted me expensive studs shoes and a high-quality hockey stick after getting her first job. She even used to take me to the ground for practice," the young defender added.

After facing rejections in 2012 and 2013, Neelam got selected for the SAI Training Centre in Hisar in 2014. faced numerous injuries immediately after joining the centre due to which she couldn't

> participate in any tournament for two years straight, and once again it was her family who assisted her in navigating through the challenging period.

> "I had injuries as soon as I joined the hostel. Sometimes my ankle was fractured. Sometimes my hamstring was pulled. I did not participate in a single tournament for two years. I would practice for a month and rest for a month," Neelam stated.

"However, my family, which has always been my biggest support system, once again motivated

me to bounce back and became my guiding light, as I began my journey of recovery and resurgence. While my eldest sister, who is also a hockey player and part of the CRPF hockey team, used to help me improve my game by imparting her knowledge and skills, my brother made sure to keep me motivated by telling me that I am the best player in my batch and could achieve anything. My mother used to say that I will recover and play in a good tournament. All in all, my family was very cooperative then and has always been my biggest support system," she concluded.

'She also went on to speak about her early years and her challenging recovery from an ACL injury.

India's Men's Junior Asia Cup 2023 winning Captain Uttam Singh also featured in the Hockey Te Charcha podcast, following India's historic triumph at the Junior Men's Asia Cup Trophy. The charismatic leader was also recently recognized as the Jugraj Singh Upcoming Player of the Year. Speaking on his achievements, he remarked, "Knowing what my parents and I have faced I know I must never get ahead of myself and at the same time I never want to settle. This is just the start; I want to achieve much more."

The most recent episode of the Hockey Te Charcha podcast featured Indian Women's Hockey Team Captain Savita Punia, who hopes to lead her team to a podium finish at the upcoming Hangzhou Asian Games in September and October 2023.

She said, "In the last Asian Games, we came close to winning the Gold medal; and losing only by a goal to Japan (1-2) in the Final was heartbreaking. This time we feel that we are more determined than ever before to finish on the top."

The star goalie also discussed how Hockey India's efforts to build a strong women's programme have helped to make hockey a financially secure career option.

Savita won the prestigious Hockey India Balbir Singh Senior Award for Player of the Year (Women) at the 5th Hockey India Annual Awards 2022.
