Tokyo Olympics Bronze to highest-ever FIH World Rankings, 2021 bring back the glory days for Indian Men's Hockey Team

The year 2021 will be cherished forever in the history of Indian sports as it gave the Indian Men's Hockey team an opportunity to end the 41-year Olympic Medal drought. Defying the odds and overcoming various challenges thrown by the deadly COVID-19 virus, the Manpreet Singh-led side clinched the historic Bronze medal at the prestigious Tokyo Olympics in August 2021.

The second year of Pandemic i.e., 2021 started on a brighter note, with the Indian team returning to international hockey after a one-year hiatus. The side had a memorable outing against teams like Germany, Great Britain and Argentina in February and March 2021, respectively. They also won both of their FIH Pro League encounters against Argentina, which helped them gain momentum ahead of the quadrennial Games.

Having spent almost one-and-a-half-year in SAI, Bengaluru before Tokyo Olympics, the Indian Men's Team Captain Manpreet, while reflecting on the year, expressed, "It's true 2021 has brought a new dawn for Indian hockey. It's been a dream year. Of course, it was full of challenges, ups and downs, and I am really proud of the way we have overcome each obstacle to bring back the Olympic glory. It was hard work of not four, but five years. We spent one whole year at the camp, trying to adapt to the new norms of life, our whole lifestyle has changed, we started living the bio-bubble life. So, there were challenges off the field as well."



At the Olympics, team India finished second in the Pool stage, winning four out of five matches and defeated Great Britain 3-1 in Quarter-Final before losing 5-2 against Belgium in their historic Semi-Final. However, India staged a remarkable comeback and earned a 5-4 win over Germany to clinch the historic Bronze medal at Olympic Games.

"The team unity was one of the biggest reasons behind our Olympics success. You know the biggest positive of all this was that we as a team came very closer, and it really helped us during the Olympics. Faith among each other was something that made the team atmosphere very positive, and it motivated us to give our best on the field," said the 29-year-old.

He further added that this success wouldn't have been possible to achieve without the undying support from the Sports Authority of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) and the Odisha State Government, which has also extended its partnership with Hockey India for 10 more years.





"We are really grateful to the Sports Authority of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) and the Odisha State Government for their undying support and motivation as this success wouldn't have been possible without them, expressed Skipper Manpreet.

Riding on their historic campaign at Olympics, the Indian Men's team also bagged FIH Hockey Stars Awards 2021 in all the categories. Harmanpreet Singh was crowned the FIH Men's Player of the Year, PR Sreejesh won the FIH Men's Goalkeeper of the Year, Vivek Sagar Prasad won FIH Men's Rising Star of the Year award for the second consecutive time and Indian Men's Hockey Chief Coach Graham Reid was awarded the FIH Men's Team Coach of the Year.

In November, members of the Indian Men's Hockey team were also conferred with National Sports Awards. PR Sreejesh and skipper Manpreet were honoured with the prestigious Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award, the highest honour for a sportsperson in India. Whereas, Rupinder Pal Singh, Surender Kumar, Birendra Lakra, Harmanpreet Singh, Dilpreet Singh, Mandeep Singh, Lalit Kumar Upadhyay, Shamsher Singh, Hardik Singh, Nilakanta Sharma, Vivek Sagar Prasad, Amit Rohidas, Sumit, Gurjant Singh, Varun Kumar and Simranjeet Singh, were conferred with Arjuna award for their heroics in Tokyo.

The Indian team finished third at the recently concluded Men's Asian Champions Trophy 2021, having defeated arch-rivals Pakistan 4-3 in a thrilling third/fourth placing match. Moreover, as per the recent world rankings announced by the FIH, the Men's Hockey team will end the dream year on the third spot, their highest-ever FIH World ranking since its introduction in 2003.

The team now looks forward to capitalising on this historic year as they gear up for the busy season in 2022.

"We are really fortunate of all the support and love, which we have received after coming back from Tokyo. We have promised our fans that we will keep working hard to make them proud again. Our goal obviously is to change the colour of this medal, and we are also aware of what it will take to do it. We have started the new cycle with Asian Champions Trophy, now we have to keep improving from here. We have a challenging schedule ahead, and we are up for it,"

Year-in-review: A fairytale year for Indian Women's Hockey Team

From a historic fourth-place finish at the prestigious Tokyo Olympics to achieving the best-ever FIH World Rankings to bagging FIH Hockey Stars Awards 2021 in all categories, the year 2021 was a fairytale for the Indian Women's Hockey Team.

The Indian eves became the first of India's hockey teams to return to international hockey after the pandemic-enforced hiatus disrupted the calendar. The team began the Olympic year 2021 with Argentina tour in January, followed by a four-match Germany tour in February.

After having spent the following months at SAI Centre in Bengaluru, the Indian Women's Hockey team went on to script history at the Tokyo Olympics in August 2021. Rani-led India, who started their campaign with three losses, pulled off arguably one of the biggest upsets in world hockey as they defeated the mighty Australian side in what was their historic Quarter-Final encounter of the Olympic Games. However, they missed out on a medal by a whisker as they narrowly lost in both Semi-Final and the Bronze Medal classification matches against Argentina and Great Britain, respectively.

Looking back at the dream year, the Indian Women's Hockey Team Captain Rani expressed, "This year was like an emotional roller coaster, full of ups and downs. But, to be honest, we really enjoyed the ride as it included the historic Tokyo Olympics campaign. I reckon 2021 was full of self-belief and determination.





There were a lot of learnings involved, and COVID-19 taught us invaluable life lessons. One of them was to stay in the present moment. Staying in the present moment helped us qualify for the Quarter Final as well as beat a team like Australia to script the history."

Following their historic performance in Tokyo, the Indian Women's team bagged FIH Hockey Stars Awards 2021 in all categories. Dragflicker Gurjit Kaur won the FIH Women's Player of The Year award, Goalkeeper Savita won the FIH Women's Goalkeeper of the Year award, Sharmila Devi clinched the FIH Women's Rising Star of the Year award, and former Indian Women's Hockey Chief Coach Sjoerd Marijne was awarded the FIH Women's Team Coach of the Year.

Additionally, members of the women's team were conferred with national awards in November 2021. Skipper Rani was honoured with Padma Shri, the country's fourthhighest civilian award, while experienced forward Vandana Katariya and midfielder Monika were conferred with the Arjuna award.

"We were really disappointed when we missed out on winning the Bronze medal. It was heartbreaking, but when we returned to India, we slowly realised the magnitude of that fourth-place finish. It is really a big thing for Indian Women's hockey. I think all these awards and accolades are an outcome of all the hard work and sacrifices made by the team over the years. It has also boosted our confidence. It will certainly motivate us to do well, and make the country proud again," said Rani. The 27-year-old further added, "The constant support and encouragement from the Sports Authority of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) and the Odisha State Government have helped us excel at the Olympics. They have been one of the biggest reasons behind the rise of Indian Women's Hockey, and we are really grateful for the undying support."

The Indian Women's hockey team, who had also achieved their highest-ever FIH World ranking (World No. 8) in August, will end the year in the ninth spot as per the latest FIH World rankings.

Speaking of the year 2022, Skipper Rani said that the team's goal will be to build on the historic Olympics campaign.

"We have set the benchmark for ourselves, and from hereon, we will have to do even better. We want to build on the historic campaign. 2022 will be a very crucial year as we have important tournaments lined up. We will look to qualify directly for the Paris Olympics 2024 by clinching gold at Asian Games 2022. But, for that, we will have to go step-by-step, and our first step will be to do well at Women's Asia Cup 2022," concluded Rani.

STORY "Advice from Senior Team's dragflick specialists has helped me a lot," says Indian Junior

Men's Hockey striker Araijeet Singh Hundal

Araijeet Singh Hundal has grabbed the attention of hockey buffs with his impressive performance at the recently-concluded FIH Odisha Hockey Men's Junior

World Cup Bhubaneswar 2021. The lanky lad from Amritsar is quick on his feet as a forward and as one of the four

penalty corner specialists in the Indian Junior side, Hundal has proved his mettle with powerful dragflicks in crunch situations to help his side. His hat-trick of goals in India's 13-1 win against Canada even earned him the Player of the Match title.

"Although I picked up the hockey stick at a very young age because of my father (Kuljeet Singh) who used to play hockey for the Railways and was even part of the India camp in 1999, I began serious practice only in 2015-2016," he said.

Araijeet made his first appearance in the domestic circuit when he played for Punjab & Sindh Bank at the Hockey India Junior Men National Championship in Bhopal, 2018. Following yet another impressive outing for his team at the Hockey India Junior Men National Championship in Aurangabad, 2019, Araijeet was called-up for the National Camp for Juniors in SAI, Bengaluru.

Though his first call-up for the National Camp in 2019 was a great experience for the youngster as he was housed in the same campus as his Senior compatriots, the nation-wide lockdown only a few months later in March 2020 meant that he had to put in some hard yards back home in Amritsar to keep up his skillsets as a potential forward for the India Colts side. "My father put up a net at home and got a small mat on which I could practice. I would take 100 dragflicks each day to hone my skills."





"Once the Camp resumed in September 2020, my interactions with the Senior team players like Rupinder and Harmanpreet was very helpful. While all of them said my technique is good, they asked me to pay more attention on my footwork, and how to release the ball. I worked a lot on my timing, power and shoulder movement after coming into the camp," expressed Araijeet Hundal.

But something that really stuck with him were the words of India defender and dragflicker Varun Kumar, who was part of India's historic Olympic Bronze Medal winning team. "He told me to keep my head up and look more confident while taking the dragflick. Another crucial advice the Seniors gave me was to study the opponent goalkeeper's weaknesses. During the lockdown, our Coach (BJ Kariappa) would also share a lot of videos of Senior Team's dragflickers on our Whatsapp group so we could study their movement and implement necessary basic changes to our style. I feel all these factors have helped a lot," he added.

Playing only his first-ever tournament for India, Araijeet reflected his excitement of turning up in the Blue Jersey. "It has been very special, no doubt. Playing in this venue (Kalinga Hockey Stadium) was always a dream," he concluded.

"Hockey is everything for me; it has changed my life," says Indian Men's Junior Team defender Shardanand Tiwari

For India Junior Men's Hockey Team defender Shardanand Tiwari, hockey is everything. Born in Lucknow, the 17-year-old player comes from a humble background and he believes hockey has helped him overcome various challenges in life and it will bring financial stability for his family.

Tiwari, who was a part of the Indian Junior Men's Core Probables Group for the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's Junior World Cup Bhubaneswar 2021, Shardanand took a moment to reflect on his journey and spoke about how he got inspired by his hardworking father, who works as a home guard in Lucknow.

"My friends introduced me to hockey, I started playing with them, and I wasn't really interested in studies, so I picked up sports. I honed my skills at SAI-Academy, Lucknow, and got a chance to play at the 9th Hockey India Junior Men National Championship 2019 (A Division), where our team Uttar Pradesh Hockey clinched the Silver Medal. After that, I got selected for

> the Junior National camp," said Shardanand, who was part of the Uttar Pradesh U21 team that clinched Gold at the Khelo India Youth Games 2020.



"It has been a challenging journey. I didn't have enough financial support initially as my father was the sole bread earner. He works as a home guard, and I have an elder brother as well, so all the earnings were spent on our studies. In fact, during my school summer breaks, I used to work at a departmental store, where I used to earn around 700 rupees. So, it was tough, I couldn't even afford to buy hockey sticks. But, ever since I picked up hockey, my life has changed. It is everything for me, it has helped me and my family overcome various challenges, and I believe it will certainly help me bring financial stability for my family," he added.

The young defender made his debut for the junior national team at the 2019 Sultan of Johar Cup, where India clinched the Silver Medal. Speaking about the achievement, Shardanand said, "It was my debut tournament with the national team, and the moment I got to know that I've made the cut, I called my dad. I told him that I will be playing for India, he got very emotional, and, that moment I realised, my dad is the reason behind it. I see him as my biggest inspiration. He used to stay awake in the night and also used to work in the day only because I and my brother could pursue our dreams."
