Subject: Revision of the norms of assistance under the Scheme of Assistance to National Sports Federations - regarding

The Government has been extending financial assistance to the National Sports Federations (NSFs) for various sports activities including training and participation of Indian sportspersons and teams in international tournaments. The guidelines for Assistance to National Sports Federations (NSFs) were formulated in 2001 vide Order No.6-6/94-SP.III, dated 14.8.2001 with a view to providing financial assistance to the NSFs, recognized by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. These guidelines also contained various instructions relating to functioning of NSFs, their recognition by the Ministry, good governance practices, anti-doping measures and categorization of sports disciplines, etc. The instructions were revised/amended from time to time. In the year 2011, the Ministry decided to amalgamate all the instructions into one comprehensive Code, viz. National Sports Development Code of India 2011, which came into effect from 31.1.2011.

- 2. Norms of assistance under the Scheme of Assistance to NSFs were revised vide circular No.8-53/2010-SP.III dated 10.6.2011 and last revised vide circular No. 12-5/203-SP-III dated 4.11.2015. A lot of developments/changes have taken place in the sports sector. Corporate houses are also extending financial support to various sports activities such as holding of international tournaments, training of top athletes, organization of prize money events etc. Various sports activities such as training to promote rural sports, recognized sports, paralympic sports and Olympic sports have been included in Schedule 7 of the Companies Act, 2013. Therefore, NSFs are expected to approach the corporate houses for resources under the CSR and generate resources on their own from corporate houses, sponsors etc., rather than solely depending on the Government for funding.
- 3. As it is primary responsibility of the NSFs to promote and develop their specific sports disciplines, NSFs have to take all steps for promotion and development including generating funds and resources. The NSFs are required to raise their own resources as well to finance their operations. The financial support available under the Scheme of Assistance to NSFs is only supplemental in nature.
- 4. Keeping in view the above factors and with a view to catering to the changing needs of sportspersons and the fact that the norms of assistance were last revised in November 2015 and the

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assistance available from other Schemes of the Ministry viz., Khelo India Scheme and Human Resource Development Scheme, it has been decided to revise the norms for extending assistance under the Scheme of Assistance to NSFs as follows:

5. All NSFs availing assistance under the Scheme must clearly reflect the logo of the MYAS/SAI at all prominent locations including digital platforms, apparels of the sportspersons. Any



Guidelines, issued by the Ministry/SAI, with regard to branding for the assistance received from the Ministry/SAI, shall be followed by NSFs.

- 6. NSFs should prominently display the funding received from the Government as well from other sources on their website as well as the Social Media platforms.
- 7. All other provisions under the Guidelines of Assistance to NSFs, such as category of sports disciplines, entitlement limits, etc. shall be governed by the instructions issued by the Ministry from time to time. Availability of assistance or otherwise under a specific component of this Scheme to a particular NSF will depend on factors like its entitlement as per its category (High Priority, Priority, Indian Traditional Sports, General), its current performance, availability of resources under the Scheme and assessment of its functioning.
- 8. Provisions of the Scheme can be relaxed/revised in consultation with IFD and with the approval of the Union Minister in-charge of Sports provided the basic nature and scope of the relevant provisions of the scheme are not altered and provided the relaxation/ revision does not require changes in budgetary allocation of the scheme.
- 9. In case any clarification is required on any provision of or any matter relating to implementation of the scheme, the same will be referred to the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, whose decision in the matter shall be final.
- 10. This issues with the approval of Hon'ble Minister for Youth Affairs & Sports and comes into force from the date of issue of this order.
